RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE DRIVER'S LICENSE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 286, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§286- Expiration of licenses; out-of-country active
5	duty military personnel. Notwithstanding section 286-106, the
6	expired driver's license of a member of any component of the
7	United States armed forces who is on active federal service and
8	whose driver's license expired while deployed outside the United
9	States, shall remain valid for ninety days after the service
10	member's return to the United States."
11	SECTION 2. Section 286-106, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	amended to read as follows:
13	"§286-106 Expiration of licenses. Every driver's license
14	issued under this part, except for a provisional license issued
15	under section 286-102.6 which shall expire on the date of the

provisional licensee's nineteenth birthday, whether an original

issuance or a renewal, shall expire on the first birthday of the

licensee occurring not less than [six] eight years after the

1	date of the issuance of the license, unless sooner revoked or
2	suspended; provided that the license shall expire on the first
3	birthday of the licensee occurring not less than four years
4	after the date of issuance if at the time the licensee is
5	twenty-four years of age or younger; provided further that the
6	license shall expire on the first birthday of the licensee
7	occurring not less than two years after the date of the issuance
8	of the license if at that time the licensee[÷
9	(1) Is] seventy-two years of age or older[; or
10	(2) Exhibits a physical condition or conditions that the
11	examiner of drivers reasonably believes has impaired
12	the driver's ability to drive, unless the licensee:
13	(A) Obtains a certificate from a licensed physician
14	that the licensee's physical condition or
15	conditions do not impair the licensee's ability
16	to drive; or
17	(B) Is able to correct the physical impairment, or is
18	able to drive safely by using a vehicle adapted
19	to overcome the physical impairment to the
20	satisfaction of the examiner of drivers.
21	The examiner of drivers may issue a license for a shorter

- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
- 6 provided that Section 2 shall take effect on November 3, 2008;
- 7 provided further that the amendments made to section 286-106,
- 8 Hawaii Revised Statutes, by this Act shall not be repealed when
- 9 that section is reenacted on January 9, 2011, pursuant to
- 10 section 15 of Act 72, Sessions Laws of Hawaii 2005.

Description:

Adjusts the length of time a person's license will remain valid based on their age and provides that military personnel whose driver's license has expired while on active duty outside of the country will be authorized to drive for 90 days upon their return to the United States. (SB3240 HD1)
