## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO OPIHI.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. In recent years, the number of edible opihi 2 found in Hawaii has declined. The popularity of opihi as a
- 3 delicacy has led to overharvesting on the island of Oahu and has
- 4 made opihi difficult to find on the neighbor islands.
- 5 The black foot opihi (Cellana exarata), also known as
- 6 "makaiauli", once the most common limpet in Hawaiian waters, is
- 7 found in the upper wash of waves. The yellow foot opihi
- 8 (Cellana sandwicensis), also known as "alinalina", is the
- 9 preferred species for eating. It is found in the wash of waves,
- 10 roughly between the habitats of the black foot opihi and
- 11 "koele", the third type of edible opihi in Hawaii. Koele is
- 12 also known as the "kneecap" opihi (Cellana talcosa). There is
- 13 also a fourth type of opihi (Cellana melanostoma) observed in
- 14 Kaua`i that probably also could be found in Niihau.
- 15 Although opihi can be collected year-round, opihi shells
- 16 must be at least one and one-fourth inches wide, or the meat

- 1 must be at least a half-inch wide, to be legally harvested in
- 2 Hawaii.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to prohibit the sale of all
- 4 Hawaiian species of edible opihi, subject to an exemption for
- 5 certain opihi shells used to make jewelry.
- 6 SECTION 2. Section 188-42.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 "[+]\$188-42.5[+] Hihiwai, hapawai, opihi, and opae
- 9 kala`ole selling prohibited. (a) It shall be unlawful for any
- 10 person at any time to sell or offer for sale any hihiwai,
- 11 hapawai, [and] opihi, or opae kala`ole taken from any of the
- 12 waters within the jurisdiction of the State. It shall be
- 13 presumed that the taking of more than one-half gallon per person
- 14 per day of opihi, as measured with its shell on, from any of the
- 15 waters within the jurisdiction of the state, is for the purpose
- 16 of selling or offering to sell opihi.
- 17 As used in this section, "opihi" means all known Hawaiian
- 18 opihi species, including Cellana exarata (black foot), Cellana
- 19 sandwicensis (yellow foot), Cellana talcosa (koele), and Cellana
- 20 melanostoma (green foot).
- 21 (b) The prohibition to sell or offer for sale any opihi as
- 22 provided by this section shall not apply to opihi shells at

- 1 least one and one-fourth inches in diameter, sold or offered for
- 2 sale as a curio or jewelry, or as part of a curio or jewelry;
- 3 provided that the taking of the opihi for these purposes is in
- 4 compliance with this section."
- 5 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval,
- 8 and shall be repealed on June 30, 2023.
