A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii must
- 2 diversify its economic base beyond tourism. A revived state
- 3 agriculture industry holds a promise of not only diversifying
- 4 Hawaii's economy, but also improving the food security of our
- 5 isolated islands and preserving the green space and lifestyle
- 6 that Hawaii's citizens and visitors value.
- 7 Hawaii's agriculture and value-added products contribute
- 8 \$2,400,000,000 to the State's economy and employ more than
- 9 thirty-eight thousand people. During the past twenty years,
- 10 diversified agriculture in Hawaii has more than doubled. The
- 11 prime agricultural lands released from sugar and pineapple
- 12 production present a rare window of opportunity to further
- 13 agricultural development and address the food security needs of
- 14 the state.
- The legislature further finds that for Hawaii's agriculture
- 16 to take advantage of this opportunity, it must produce safe,
- 17 high-quality, and market-driven products that offset Hawaii's

- 1 high costs of land, labor, water, and transportation. Hawaii's
- 2 food and agricultural producers and processors must produce
- 3 foods that are safe and nutritious by following established good
- 4 agricultural practices (GAP) and being GAP certified. There is
- 5 also a need for assistance in developing value-added processed
- 6 foods that would assist entrepreneurs to develop new products
- 7 that use Hawaii grown produce. There is a need for a local
- 8 facility to provide assistance for sensory evaluations of food,
- 9 as well as appropriate packaging and marketing advice. Thus, a
- 10 food innovation and security center is necessary to help address
- 11 the food safety and security needs of Hawaii.
- 12 The University of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture
- 13 and human resources is engaged in several areas of research and
- 14 outreach that have already contributed to the resurgence of
- 15 agriculture in Hawaii. The college's contributions to the
- 16 State's agricultural industry include:
- 17 (1) Identification and development of high-value food,
- 18 plant, and fiber products to help Hawaii stay
- 19 competitive in a global market; and
- 20 (2) Creation of an agribusiness incubator that helps start
- 21 agribusinesses and assists existing agribusinesses to
- expand.

- 1 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to the
- 2 University of Hawaii to enable the college of tropical
- 3 agriculture and human resources to develop a long range plan for
- 4 a food innovation and security center for the development and
- 5 promotion of new, safe, high-quality, high-value agricultural
- 6 products.
- 7 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$300,000, or so much
- 9 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the
- 10 same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 11 2008-2009, for the college of tropical agriculture and human
- 12 resources to develop a long range plan for a food innovation and
- 13 security center.
- 14 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the University
- 15 of Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 16 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
