A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FOOD WASTE RECYCLING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

| 1 | SECTION 1. The legislature finds that waste disposal is an |

| 2 | issue of critical importance throughout the islands. Section |
| 3 | 226-15, Hawaii Revised Statutes, declares that "it shall be the |
| 4 | policy of this State to [p]romote re-use and recycling to |
| 5 | reduce solid and liquid wastes and employ a conservation ethic." |
| 6 | The legislature further finds that state facilities and |
| 7 | public schools are among the largest institutional generators of |
| 8 | food waste, in spite of current recycling efforts. Despite |
| 9 | statewide policies, recycling efforts still reduce only a |
| 10 | fraction of the solid and liquid waste generated. Landfills on |
| 11 | all islands are approaching or have already reached their |
| 12 | maximum capacity, and both expansion of current landfills and |
| 13 | relocation efforts are meeting widespread community opposition. |
| 14 | Food waste recycling falls within the program elements of |
| 15 | the integrated solid waste management plans under chapter 342G, |
| 16 | Hawaii Revised Statutes. Moneys to implement and administer |

- 1 this important state effort will come from the environmental
- 2 management special fund.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to establish a three-year pilot
- 4 project in one or more school districts, chosen by the
- 5 department of education and in partnership with the department
- 6 of health, for recycling food waste as part of the State's
- 7 integrated solid waste management plans under chapter 342G,
- 8 Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 9 SECTION 2. The department of education, in partnership
- 10 with the department of health, shall develop and implement a
- 11 three-year food waste recycling pilot project in one or more
- 12 school districts that is in accordance with chapter 342G, Hawaii
- 13 Revised Statutes.
- 14 The program sites shall be determined by the department of
- 15 education as those most suitable in meeting the pilot project's
- 16 objectives.
- 17 The department of health shall cooperate with the
- 18 department of education to develop and implement the components
- 19 of the pilot project.
- 20 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 21 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 22 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and

- 1 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 2 year 2008-2009, to develop and implement a three-year food waste
- 3 recycling pilot project in one or more public school districts.
- 4 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 5 of education for the purposes of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 4. The department of education, with the
- 7 assistance of the department of health, shall submit interim
- 8 reports of the pilot project to the legislature no later than
- 9 twenty days prior to the convening of the regular sessions of
- 10 2008 and 2009, and a final report to the legislature no later
- 11 than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session
- 12 of 2010. The reports shall include information and
- 13 recommendations about the efficacy of, and costs associated with
- 14 the food waste recycling pilot project. The final report shall
- 15 also include a recommendation on whether the food waste
- 16 recycling pilot project should be made permanent.
- 17 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.

Description:

Requires the department of education, in a partnership with the department of health, to establish a three-year food waste recycling pilot project within public school districts. Makes a general fund appropriation for this purpose. (SB871 HD1)
