A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FOOD WASTE RECYCLING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that waste disposal is an
 issue of critical importance throughout the islands. Section
 226-15, Hawaii Revised Statutes, declares that "it shall be the
 policy of this State to . . . [p]romote re-use and recycling to
 reduce solid and liquid wastes and employ a conservation ethic."

6 The legislature further finds that state facilities and 7 public schools are among the largest institutional generators of 8 food waste, in spite of current recycling efforts. Despite 9 statewide policies, recycling efforts still reduce only a 10 fraction of the solid and liquid waste generated. Landfills on 11 all islands are approaching or have already reached their 12 maximum capacity, and both expansion of current landfills and relocation efforts are meeting widespread community opposition. 13 14 Food waste recycling falls within the program elements of 15 the integrated solid waste management plans under chapter 342G, 16 Hawaii Revised Statutes. Moneys to implement and administer



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this important state effort will come from the environmental
 management special fund.

3 The purpose of this Act is to establish a three-year pilot 4 project in one or more school districts, chosen by the 5 department of education and in partnership with the department 6 of health, for recycling food waste as part of the State's 7 integrated solid waste management plans under chapter 342G, 8 Hawaii Revised Statutes.

9 SECTION 2. The department of education, in partnership
10 with the department of health, shall develop and implement a
11 three-year food waste recycling pilot project in one or more
12 school districts that is in accordance with chapter 342G, Hawaii
13 Revised Statutes.

14 The program sites shall be determined by the department of 15 education as those most suitable in meeting the pilot project's 16 objectives.

17 The department of health shall cooperate with the18 department of education to develop and implement the components19 of the pilot project.

20 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the environmental
 21 management special fund the sum of \$ or so much
 22 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the SB871 HD2 HMS 2007-3697



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same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
 2008-2009, to develop and implement a three-year food waste
 recycling pilot project in one or more public school districts.
 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
 of education for the purposes of this Act.

6 SECTION 4. The department of education, with the assistance of the department of health, shall submit interim 7 8 reports of the pilot project to the legislature no later than 9 twenty days prior to the convening of the regular sessions of 10 2008 and 2009, and a final report to the legislature no later 11 than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session 12 of 2010. The reports shall include information and 13 recommendations about the efficacy of and the costs associated 14 with the food waste recycling pilot project. The final report 15 shall also include a recommendation on whether the food waste 16 recycling pilot project should be made permanent.

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SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.

REPORT Title:

Food Waste Recycling; Solid Waste

Description:

Requires the department of education, in a partnership with the department of health, to establish a three-year food waste recycling pilot project within public school districts. Makes an environmental management special fund appropriation for this purpose. (SB871 HD2)
