SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO CONVENE A PILOT PROJECT TO ALLOW A SCHOOL COMPLEX TO IDENTIFY CRITICAL DEPARTMENT RULES AND POLICIES THAT IMPEDE EFFECTIVE DECISION-MAKING, ADMINISTERING, AND TEACHING AND TO OPERATE FREE OF THOSE RULES AND POLICIES.

WHEREAS, the key to Hawaii's future success is a strong 1 public school system that equips our keiki with the knowledge, 2 skills, and experiences necessary to succeed; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, school administrators and teachers have the most direct responsibility to provide students with those knowledge, 6 skills, and experiences; and 7 8 WHEREAS, school administrators and teachers may not have 9 the authority or ability to provide certain learning 10 opportunities to students because of Department of Education 11 (Department) rules and policies; and 12 13 WHEREAS, charter schools have been given the opportunity to 14 operate free of many of the department rules and policies; and 15 16 WHEREAS, administrators and teachers have expressed that 17 the provision of more authority and opportunity to 18 administrators and teachers would enhance learning in the 19 schools and result in increased accountability; now, therefore, 20 21 22 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2008, the 23 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 24 Education is requested to establish at least one three year 25 pilot model complex to include one high school, a middle school, 26 and at least one elementary school, which shall: 27 28



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In year one, identify department rules and policies 1 (1)2 that most impede its ability and authority to promote 3 effective learning for its students; 4 5 (2)In year two, after consultation with the Department of Education, the exclusive representatives for 6 7 bargaining units for teachers, principals, and 8 classified personnel and consideration of compliance 9 and health and safety concerns, be allowed to operate free of identified and agreed upon department rules 10 11 and policies, if permitted by law; and 12 13 (3) In year three, assess and evaluate the impact of the pilot project and prepare a report of its findings and 14 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, 15 16 to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2011; and 17 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 20 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the 21 Board of Education and the Superintendent of Education. 22
