A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PHOTOVOLTAIC ENERGY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature is in support of renewable
- 2 energy programs to reduce dependence on imported fossil fuels
- 3 and to promote the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions, while
- 4 increasing energy security by minimizing the impacts of supply
- 5 disruptions and pricing volatility.
- 6 The legislature finds that the high initial cost of
- 7 purchasing renewable energy systems is a barrier to the
- 8 installation and utilization of these types of technologies.
- 9 The legislature also finds that the renewable energy income tax
- 10 credit, the high cost of electricity, and other market-based
- 11 incentives may not be sufficient to encourage, in particular,
- 12 the use of photovoltaic systems throughout Hawaii.
- 13 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to encourage and
- 14 authorize the public utilities commission to establish a
- 15 ratepayer-funded photovoltaic rebate program to promote the use
- 16 of this renewable energy technology to utility customers within
- 17 electric utility service areas, if the public utilities

- 1 commission determines after an assessment of the costs and
- 2 benefits of such a program that it is in the public interest to
- 3 establish such a program.
- 4 SECTION 2. Chapter 269, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 5 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 6 and to read as follows:
- 7 "§269- Photovoltaic rebate program; establishment. (a)
- 8 The public utilities commission may establish a ratepayer-funded
- 9 photovoltaic rebate program upon evaluating the costs and
- 10 benefits of a rebate program and determining that a rebate
- 11 program is in the public interest.
- 12 (b) To qualify for the photovoltaic rebate program,
- 13 applicants shall comply with requirements and conditions
- 14 established by the public utilities commission.
- 15 (c) Rebate amounts and other program specifications for
- 16 the photovoltaic rebate program shall be established by the
- 17 public utilities commission.
- 18 (d) The public utilities commission shall effectuate the
- 19 purposes of this section by rules adopted pursuant to chapter 91
- 20 or order.

- 1 (e) The public utilities commission may delegate the
- 2 administration of the photovoltaic rebate program to the public
- 3 benefits fund administrator established pursuant to section
- 4 <u>269-122.</u>"
- 5 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008, and

7 shall be repealed on June 30, 2013.
