
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the interagency
2 working group established pursuant to part VIII of Act 51,
3 Session Laws of Hawaii 2004, the "Reinventing Education Act of
4 2004," as amended by Act 225, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006 (Act
5 51, as amended), has recommended to the legislature that the
6 transfer of functions from the department of health to the
7 department of education specified in Act 51, as amended, be
8 amended to repeal the transfer of the public health nurses who
9 supervise school health aides. The school health aides are
10 scheduled to transfer July 1, 2007, from the department of
11 health to the department of education.

12 The interagency working group report states that the
13 department of education and the department of health supported
14 the transfer of the school health aides and the repeal of the
15 transfer of the public health nurses who supervise school health
16 aides. The report also stated that the Hawaii Government
17 Employees Association opposed the transfer of the school health
18 aides. The Hawaii Government Employees Association stated that



1 their objection to any transfer of state employees to the
2 department of education is based on their concern for the
3 employees whose positions and funds might be allocated to the
4 schools through the weighted student formula. The department of
5 education stated that a policy decision has been made not to
6 allocate the school health aides positions through the weighted
7 student formula for the fiscal biennium 2007-2009.

8 The legislature further finds that the department of
9 education and the department of health have agreed that the
10 public health nurses who supervise the school health aides
11 should remain at the department of health and provide clinical
12 supervision to the school health aides through a service level
13 agreement or memorandum of understanding. Both departments
14 recognize that transferring the public health nurse positions to
15 the department of education would require the department of
16 health to request replacement positions to carry out essential
17 public health functions. Additionally, the number of public
18 health nurses that would be transferred to the department of
19 education would be insufficient to provide the level of
20 supervision necessary for the school health services program.
21 As a result, both departments have concluded that the best
22 method of supporting the school health services program is to



1 provide clinical supervision for school health aides through a
2 service level agreement or memorandum of understanding.

3 The school health aides are the primary component of the
4 school health services program established within the department
5 of health. With the transfer of the school health aides to the
6 department of education, the program should also be transferred
7 to the department of education.

8 The purpose of this Act is to repeal the transfer of the
9 public health nurses who supervise the school health aides from
10 the department of health to the department of education and
11 repeal the school health services program from chapter 321,
12 Hawaii Revised Statutes, and enact the program in chapter 302A,
13 Hawaii Revised Statutes.

14 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
16 to read as follows:

17 "PART . SCHOOL HEALTH SERVICES PROGRAM

18 §302A- Purpose; establishment of program. The purpose
19 of this part is to establish a statewide school health services
20 program. There shall be within the department a permanent
21 comprehensive school health services program for grades
22 kindergarten through twelve in all the public schools of this



1 State. It is in the general welfare of the State to protect,
2 preserve, care for, and improve the physical and mental health
3 of Hawaii's children by making available at the public schools
4 first aid and emergency care, preventive health care, health
5 appraisals and follow-ups, and health room facilities.

6 **§302A- Teenage health program.** The department, in
7 cooperation with the department of health, may establish a
8 statewide teenage health program designed to enhance
9 self-esteem, facilitate communication between students and their
10 parents, incorporate ho'oponopono techniques in group
11 discussions, expand peer counseling efforts, and provide more
12 counseling opportunities. In implementing this program, the
13 department shall strive to respect and include the diverse needs
14 and values of parents and teens served by the program.

15 **§302A- Department implementation.** The department shall
16 implement this program with the present health services now
17 provided to those schools under the pilot project established
18 under Act 130, Session Laws of Hawaii 1970, to each public
19 school, and further provide the necessary number of health aides
20 in order to service each public school. The department may
21 provide health related screening services at each public school.



1 School health aides may assist the student by administering
2 oral and topical medication, and in emergency situations, other
3 premeasured medication; provided that:

4 (1) If the student receiving the medication is a minor, a
5 parent or guardian requests and authorizes the
6 administration of medication;

7 (2) The medication has been prescribed by a licensed
8 physician, as defined in section 334-1, or by a
9 practitioner with prescriptive authority;

10 (3) The administration of the medication is with the
11 approval of the department of health; and

12 (4) The administration of the medication is necessary for
13 the health of the student and for the student's
14 attendance at school.

15 **§302A- School health aides.** All full-time school health
16 aides employed in the department shall be employed and have
17 their compensation fixed in accordance with chapter 76 and the
18 appropriate collective bargaining agreement, executive order,
19 executive directive, or rule; provided that the compensation
20 shall be based on a six and one-half hour work day; provided
21 further that:



- 1 (1) The monthly rate of compensation for all school health
2 aides employed less than full-time shall be based on
3 the number of hours they actually work;
- 4 (2) The monthly rate of compensation for full-time health
5 aides so determined shall be multiplied by ten and
6 then divided by twelve and the resulting amount shall
7 be the employee's monthly salary payable over a
8 twelve-month period; and
- 9 (3) The health aides shall have the same working schedule
10 and leave allowance as school teachers in the
11 department.

12 **§302A- Rules.** The superintendent of education shall
13 adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 for the purposes of this
14 part."

15 SECTION 3. Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004, as amended
16 by Act 225, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006, is amended by amending
17 section 47 to read as follows:

18 "SECTION 47. (a) All the rights, powers, functions,
19 duties, and resources of:

- 20 (1) The department of budget and finance relating to the:
21 (A) Funding of collective bargaining agreement
22 increases; and



1 (B) Securing, administering use, and expending of
2 federal funds and other aid, including their
3 custodial supervision; and

4 (2) The department of health relating to school health
5 aides [~~and public health nurses who supervise school~~
6 ~~health aides~~];

7 are transferred to the department of education effective
8 July 1, 2007, subject to repeal by subsequent legislation.

9 (b) All moneys budgeted in support of each position to be
10 transferred to the department of education, including moneys for
11 direct and indirect employee benefits, are transferred to the
12 department of education effective July 1, 2007, subject to
13 repeal by subsequent legislation."

14 SECTION 4. Effective July 1, 2007, the department of
15 education shall provide career pathways development and training
16 opportunities to all school health aides in the school health
17 services field and other fields within the department of
18 education to ensure the opportunity for continued employment
19 with the department of education.

20 SECTION 5. Chapter 321, part XIX, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
21 is repealed.



1 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
2 and stricken.

3 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on June 29, 2007.
