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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION FOR FOSTER CHILDREN.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that stability is a 2 serious issue facing Hawaii's foster children and that foster 3 children who experience psychological and emotional trauma, due to removal from family, additionally suffer educational setbacks 4 5 due to frequent changes in school placement. Foster children, including foster youth, may change schools many times during a 6 7 single school year. Each time a child changes schools, he or 8 she must confront new personnel, new subject matter, and new 9 students, while also having to adjust to a new home environment. 10 As the school year progresses, teachers build on concepts from 11 prior lessons to take children to new levels of understanding. 12 Every time a child changes schools, the child is thrown into a 13 new environment, is immediately behind, and will not receive the 14 full intended benefit of a year's worth of coursework, as the 15 child has not participated in the prior lessons. Every time a child changes schools, the child must acclimate to the new 16 17 environment and spend significant time getting accustomed to the

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1 teaching methods and the dynamics of particular groups of 2 students that are inherently different from the child's prior 3 classroom. Research has shown that with every change in school 4 placement, a foster child falls behind at least one-half to one 5 full grade level.

6 Many foster children receive specialized education, therapy 7 services, and tutoring services. When they change schools, 8 these services are often delayed. Further, instability and 9 problems in school increase difficulties in the home for foster 10 children. Providing stability in school will support foster 11 placements and help prevent instability at home as well as at 12 school.

13 The purpose of this Act is to provide educational stability 14 for foster children, regardless of what is happening within 15 their biological or foster families.

16 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
17 amended by adding three new sections to part IV, subpart C, to
18 be appropriately designated and to read as follows:

19 "<u>\$302A-A</u> <u>Definitions.</u> For purposes of sections 302A-B and
 20 <u>302A-C</u>, unless the context requires otherwise, the following
 21 definitions shall apply:



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1	"Foster child" means a child placed in foster care or
2	permanent custody of the department of human services pursuant
3	to chapter 587.
4	"School of origin" means the school that a foster child
5	attended at the time the foster child was placed into the foster
6	custody or permanent custody of the department of human services
7	pursuant to chapter 587.
8	<u>§302A-B</u> School placement decisions for foster children.
9	Decisions on where a foster child will be enrolled in school
10	shall be made based on the best interest of the foster child;
11	provided that, in making these determinations, the department,
12	in consultation with the department of human services, the
13	foster child's guardian ad litem, and the family court, as
14	appropriate, shall presume, to the extent feasible, that it is
15	in the foster child's best interest to:
16	(1) Keep the foster child in the foster child's school of
17	origin:
18	(A) Until the end of the school year; or
19	(B) For a foster child in high school, until the
20	foster child completes the foster child's senior
21	year; and
22	(2) Follow the wishes of the foster child.





§302A-C Comparable services. Foster children, including 1 those living outside the geographic area of the school district, 2 3 shall receive comparable services to children living within the 4 district including: 5 (1) Transportation services, including supervised transportation between schools and their foster homes; 6 7 (2) Tutoring services; 8 (3) Counseling services; and Extracurricular activities." 9 (4) 10 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 11 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 12 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 to 13 the department of education for the provision of comparable transportation services for foster children. 14 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 15 education for the purposes of this Act. 16 SECTION 4. In codifying the new sections added by section 17 2 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute 18 19 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating 20 the new sections in this Act.

21 SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.

22 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
