A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TATTOO ARTISTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 321-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
3	" (a)	The department of health, with the approval of the
4	governor,	may adopt rules as it deems necessary for the public
5	health or	safety respecting:
6	(1)	The occupations or practices of clinical laboratory
7		directors, medical technologists (clinical laboratory
8		scientists), clinical laboratory specialists,
9		cytotechnologists, medical laboratory technicians
10		(clinical laboratory technicians), [tattoo artists,]
11		and environmental health professionals;
12	(2)	The health, education, training, experience, habits,
13		qualifications, or character of persons to whom
14		certificates of registration or permits for these
15		occupations or practices may be issued;
16	(3)	The health, habits, character, practices, standards,
17		or conduct of persons holding these certificates or
18		permits; and

- (4) The grounds or causes for revoking or suspending these
 certificates or permits.
- 3 The rules shall have the force and effect of law."
- 4 SECTION 2. Section 321-371, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 "[+]\$321-371[+] Purpose. The purpose of this part is [the
- 7 protection of to protect the public health and safety through
- 8 the [licensing and regulation] registration of tattoo artists."
- 9 SECTION 3. Section 321-372, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended by deleting the definition of "facial tattoo".
- 11 [""Facial tattoo" means any tattoo applied above the
- 12 jawline, anterior to the ear and frontal hairline including the
- 13 evelids, evebrows, or lips."]
- 14 SECTION 4. Section 321-374, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 "\$321-374 [License] Registration required; exemptions.
- 17 (a) Except as otherwise provided by law, no person shall
- 18 practice the occupation of tattoo artist in this State either
- 19 gratuitously or for pay, or shall announce oneself either
- 20 publicly or privately as prepared or qualified to practice that
- 21 occupation without having [a valid unrevoked license to do so.]
- 22 first registered with the department.

1 The application for registration shall be submitted on (b) 2 forms provided by the department. Upon approval by the 3 department, a copy of the registration shall be provided to the 4 applicant; provided that the registration fee pursuant to 5 section 321-382 has been paid in full. The application shall 6 include information as required by the department. (c) Physicians holding a valid unrevoked license under 7 8 chapter 453 or 460 are exempt from the requirements of this 9 part." SECTION 5. Section 321-381, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 10 11 amended to read as follows: 12 "[{}]\$321-381[}] [Biennial] Annual registration renewal; failure to renew. [The biennial renewal fee shall be paid to 13 14 the department of health] Registration shall be renewed 15 annually. Annual registration renewal applications shall be 16 submitted to the department on or before December 31 of each 17 [even numbered] year. [Failure, neglect, or refusal of any 18 licensee to pay the biennial renewal fee on or before such date 19 shall constitute a forfeiture of the license.] "

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    shall be issued unless the applicant takes an examination as
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    prescribed by the director and receives a passing score. No
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    license shall be issued unless all fees required by the director
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    have been paid.
         (b) The department may contract with a professional
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    testing service to prepare, administer, and grade the
    examination for licensure as a tattoo artist. For these
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    purposes, the department may require applicants to pay the
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    examination fee directly to the testing service."]
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         SECTION 9. Section 321-376, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    repealed.
         ["§321-376 Facial tattoos. Application of facial tattoos
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    shall be prohibited except by a physician licensed under chapter
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    453 or 460, or by a tattoo artist who is under the general
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    supervision of such a physician."]
         SECTION 10. Section 321-377, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    repealed.
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1	["§321-377 Suspension, revocation, or denial of the
2	renewal of license. The director may revoke, suspend, or deny
3	the renewal of the license of any person applying to be licensed
4	under this part who:
5	(1) Is found guilty of any fraud, deceit, or misconduct in
6	the practice of the occupation of tattoo artist; or
7	(2) Violates this part or any of the rules adopted by the
8	department.
9	In every case where it is proposed to revoke, suspend, or
10	deny the renewal of a license, the director shall give the
11	licensee or applicant concerned notice and a hearing. The
12	notice shall be given in writing by registered or certified mail
13	with return receipt requested at least fifteen days before the
14	hearing. All hearings shall be conducted pursuant to chapter
15	91."]

2		by any court and the decree has not since been
3		dismissed; or
4	(3)	Proceedings brought against the applicant pursuant to
5		this section resulted in findings of any of the causes
6		listed in subsection 321-379(b).

8	denied sha	11 be given notice and the opportunity for a
9	hearing."]

7		practice as a tattoo artist;
8	(4)	Submitting to or filing with the department any
9		application, notice, statement, or other document in
10		procuring or attempting to procure licensure as a
11		tattoo artist, which is false or untrue or contains
12		any material misstatement of fact;
13	(5)	Using the title, licensed tattoo artist, or any
14		designation tending to imply that the person is a
15		licensed tattoo artist when the person is not in fact
16		licensed or the person's license has been suspended or
17		revoked;
18	(6)	Violating conditions or limitations upon which
19		licensure occurs;
20	(7)	Engaging in dishonorable, unethical, or unprofessional
21		conduct of a character likely to deceive, defraud, or

1		harm an individual or the public in the course of
2		professional services or activities;
3	(8)	Having disciplinary action taken against the tattee
4		artist in another state;
5	(9)	Aiding or abetting an unlicensed person, knowingly
6		combining or conspiring with an unlicensed person,
7		allowing one's license to be used by an unlicensed
8		person, or acting as agent or associate of an
9		unlicensed person to evade the use of title
10		restrictions of this part;
11	(10)	Engaging in false or misleading advertising; or
12	(11)	Engaging in sexual conduct in connection with
13		professional services or activities.
14	(c)	In any proceeding under this section the person
15	subject t	o the proceeding shall be given notice and the
16	opportuni	ty for a hearing in conformity with chapter 91."]
17	SECT	ION 13. Section 321-380, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
18	repealed.	
19	[" [\$	321-380] Penalties. (a) Any person against whom
20	proceeding	gs have been brought pursuant to section 321 379 which
21	resulted	in findings of any of the causes listed in subsection
22	321 - 379 (b) may be assessed a fine of not less than \$100 nor more
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- 1 than \$5,000 for each offense. Any action taken to impose or
- 2 collect the penalty provided for in this subsection shall be
- 3 considered a civil action.
- 4 (b) The director may bring a civil action to enjoin any
- 5 person for violation of section 321 379(b)."]
- 6 SECTION 14. Section 321-383, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 7 repealed.
- 8 ["[\$321-383] License without necessity of examination.
- 9 All persons holding valid licenses as tattoo artists from the
- 10 department of health and practicing on the day prior to
- 11 January 1, 1991, shall be considered licensed under this part on
- 12 January 1, 1991, without necessity of examination."]

- 14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 16. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
