A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HIGH TECHNOLOGY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

2	SECTION 1. Section 206M-15, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
3	amended by amending subsections (b), (c), and (d) to read as	
4	follows:	
5	"(b) The development corporation may provide [grants as

2		event that insufficient funds are available to fund
3		otherwise qualified applicants; and
4	(3)	Give preference to all qualified businesses receiving
5		their first award [in one fiscal year] over multiple
6		award grantees.
7	The devel	opment corporation may adopt any other rules pursuant
8	to chapte	r 91 necessary for the purposes of this section.
9	(d)	If funds appropriated for the purpose of making grants
10	under thi	s section are inadequate to satisfy all qualified
11	requests,	the development corporation [shall] may apply for
12	funds to	be transferred from the Hawaii capital loan revolving
13	fund to p	rovide the grants in accordance with subsection (b).
14	The amoun	t of any single transfer of funds shall not exceed
15	\$100,000,	and the development corporation shall transfer the
16	entire am	ount back to the Hawaii capital loan revolving fund
17	within tw	elve months of receiving the funds. No more than one
18	fund tran	sfer shall be outstanding at any one time. The
19	director	of business, economic development, and tourism may
20	transfer	funds from the Hawaii capital loan revolving fund to

- 1 purposes of this section. Transfers of funds shall be made
- 2 without any charges or fees."
- 3 SECTION 2. Act 255, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006,
- 4 appropriated \$400,000 for fiscal year 2006-2007 for the high
- 5 technology development corporation to establish an international
- 6 business and technology incubator program with Hawaii and China
- 7 technology businesses, with the program to be implemented
- 8 through the high technology innovation corporation.
- 9 Section 3 of this Act repeals the high technology
- 10 innovation corporation, leaving the funds remaining from the Act
- 11 255, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006, appropriation to be redirected
- 12 for other programs providing assistance to technology industry
- 13 entrepreneurs and start-up companies, pursuant to Act 255.
- 14 The high technology development corporation shall expend
- 15 any funds remaining from the appropriation in Act 255, Session
- 16 Laws of Hawaii 2006, for small business innovation research
- 17 grants, or small business technology transfer program grants in
- 18 2008 and 2009. The high technology development corporation
- 19 shall report to the legislature on these grant expenditures no
- 20 later than twenty days prior to the regular sessions of 2009 and
- 21 2010.

Report Title:

High Technology Development Corporation Loans and Grants

Description:

Part I removes the \$25,000 limit on HTDC grants to recipients of federal small business innovation research phase I awards or contracts, or federal small business technology transfer program awards; retains limit of fifty per cent of the federal award or contract; requires HTDC to expend any remaining 2006-2007 funds on grants in 2008 and 2009 and to report to the 2009 and 2010 legislature on expenditures; part II repeals chapter 206M, part IV, HRS.
