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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ENVIRONMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. (a) The global warming task	force is						
2	established within the department of health for administrative							
3	purposes only to:							
4	(1) Assess the current and potential impacts of climate							
5	warming trends on the citizens, nat	ural resources, and						
6	the economy of the State, including	impacts on:						
7	(A) The visitor industry;							
8	(B) Intrastate and interstate air	and sea						
9	transportation of cargo and pe	rsons;						
10	(C) Existing buildings and public	utilities						
11	infrastructure;							
12	(D) Population health; and							
13	(E) Native plants, animals, and ec	osystems;						
14	(2) Assess the potential impacts of rising ocean levels a							
15	a result of climate change on the citizens, natural							
16	resources, and the economy of the S	tate, including						
17	impacts on:							

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1		(A)	The visitor industry;				
2		(B)	Shoreline erosion;				
3		(C)	Intrastate and interstate air and sea				
4			transportation of cargo and persons;				
5		(D)	Existing buildings and public utilities				
6			infrastructure;				
7		(E)	Population health; and				
8		(F)	Native plants, animals, and ecosystems;				
9	(3)	Estimate the costs to the State and its citizens of					
10		adverse effects associated with climate warming and					
11		rising sea levels; and					
12	(4)	Make recommendations to the legislature and the					
13		governor on measures that would address or mitigate					
14		the near and long term effects of climate change,					
15		including:					
16		(A)	Preventing shoreline erosion;				
17		(B)	Preserving the visitor industry;				
18		(C)	Relocating transportation infrastructure such as				
19			airports and shipping terminals;				
20		(D)	Implementing restrictions on construction in				
21			affected areas;				
22		(E)	Improving or hardening utilities infrastructure;				

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1		(F) Preparing for health emergencies; and							
2		(G) Maintaining the health and resilience of native							
3		species and ecosystems.							
4	(b)	The global warming task force shall consist of							
5	twenty-ni	ne members, as follows:							
6	(1)	The governor or governor's designee;							
7	(2)	Two members of the house of representatives, to be							
8		appointed by the speaker of the house of							
9		representatives;							
10	(3)	3) Two members of the senate, to be appointed by the							
11		president of the senate;							
12	(4)	The directors or their designees of the following							
13		state entities:							
14		(A) Department of health;							
15		(B) Department of business, economic development, and							
16		tourism;							
17		(C) Department of transportation;							
18		(D) Department of agriculture; and							
19		(E) Department of land and natural resources;							
20	(5)	The adjutant general or the adjutant general's							
21		designee;							

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1	(6)	The chairperson of the public utilities commission or				
2		the chairperson's designee;				
3	(7)	One member from each county to be appointed by the				
4		mayor of that county;				
5	(8)	One member from the University of Hawaii with				
6		expertise in geophysics or climatology, appointed by				
7		the governor;				
8	(9)	One member from the University of Hawaii with				
9		expertise in environmental engineering, appointed by				
10		the governor;				
11	(10)	One member from the Hawaii Tourism Authority;				
12	(11)	One member from the Waikiki Improvement Association;				
13	(12)	One member from each branch of the United States armed				
14		services and the Coast Guard;				
15	(13)	One member from the United States Army Corps of				
16		Engineers; and				
17	(14)	Three members selected to represent the interests of				
18		affected ocean user groups such as watermen,				
19		fishermen, and surfers, to be appointed by the				
20		governor.				
21	Members of the task force shall serve without compensation,					

22 be reimbursed for expenses necessary for the performance of

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1	their dut	ies, and be exempt from the requirements of section							
2	26-34, Hawaii Revised Statutes.								
3	(c) The task force shall:								
4	(1)	(1) Select a chairperson, collect information, research							
5		reports and expert opinion, and conduct hearings							
6		throughout the State to fulfill the purpose of this							
7		Act;							
8	(2)	Submit a preliminary report of its findings and							
9		recommendations, including proposed legislation, if							
10		any, to the legislature no later than twenty days							
11		prior to the convening of the regular session of 2009;							
12		and							
13	(3)	Submit a final report of its findings and							
14		recommendations, including proposed legislation, if							
15		any, to the legislature no later than twenty days							
16		prior to the convening of the regular session of 2010.							
17	(d)	The task force shall cease to exist on June 30, 2010.

19	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
