# A BILL FOR AN ACT

### RELATING TO ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTIES FOR DAMAGE TO STONY CORAL AND LIVE ROCK.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 187A-12.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

"[+]\$187A-12.5[+] General administrative penalties. (a) 3 Except as otherwise provided by law, the board is authorized to 4 set, charge, and collect administrative fines and to recover 5 administrative fees and costs, including attorney's fees and 6 7 costs, or bring legal action to recover administrative fines, fees, and costs, including attorney's fees and costs, or payment 8 for damages or for the cost to correct damages resulting from a 9 10 violation of subtitle 5 of title 12 or any rule adopted 11 thereunder.

12 (b) For violations involving threatened or endangered13 species, the administrative fines shall be as follows:

14 (1) For a first violation, a fine of not more than \$5,000;
15 (2) For a second violation within five years of a previous
16 violation, a fine of not more than \$10,000; and

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1	(3)	For a third or subsequent violation within five years
2		of the last violation, a fine of not more than
3		\$15,000.
4	(C)	For all other violations, the administrative fines
5	shall be	as follows:
6	(1)	For a first violation, a fine of not more than \$1,000;
7	(2)	For a second violation within five years of a previous
8		violation, a fine of not more than \$2,000; and
9	(3)	For a third or subsequent violation within five years
10		of the last violation, a fine of not more than \$3,000.
11	(d)	In addition to subsection (b), a fine of up to \$5,000
12	may be le	vied for each specimen of threatened or endangered
13	aquatic l	ife taken, killed, or injured in violation of subtitle
14	5 of titl	e 12 or any rule adopted thereunder.
15	<u>(e)</u>	In addition to subsection (c), a fine may be levied
16	for damag	ing or breaking stony coral or live rock in an amount
17	equal to	the greater of:
18	(1)	Up to \$10,000 per square meter of area damaged; or
19	(2)	The value of the particular area damaged, determined
20		by using an accepted economic valuation method.
21	This subs	ection shall apply only for an act that is intentional
22	<u>or in tot</u> a	al disregard of damaging or breaking stony coral or

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1	live rock in an area of not less than square feet. This			
2	subsection shall not apply if the damage is caused by an act			
3	committed in an emergency situation where life and limb are			
4	threatened.			
5	$\left[\frac{(e)}{(f)}\right]$ In addition to subsection (c), a fine of up to			
6	\$1,000 may be levied for each specimen of all other aquatic life			
7	taken, killed, or injured in violation of subtitle 5 of title 12			
8	or any rule adopted thereunder.			
9	[(f)] (g) Any criminal penalty for any violation of			
10	subtitle 5 of title 12 or any rule adopted thereunder shall not			
11	be deemed to preclude the State from recovering additional			
12	administrative fines, fees, and costs, including attorney's fees			
13	and costs.			
14	(h) For the purposes of this section:			
15	"Accepted economic valuation method" means a valuation			
16	approach to estimating the value of a reef within a total			
17	economic framework, including considering such indicia as direct			
18	and indirect uses, option values, bequest values, and existence			
19	values.			
20	"Breaking" means hitting or applying sufficient force to			
21	reduce to smaller pieces or to crack without actually separating			
22	into pieces.			

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1	"Damaging" means causing extensive injury resulting in		
2	irreparable harm or death.		
3	"Live rock" means any rock or coral to which marine life is		
4	visibly attached.		
5	"Stony coral" means any of a variety of invertebrate		
6	species belonging to the order Scleractinia characterized by		
7	having a hard, calcareous skeleton that are native to the		
8	Hawaiian Islands."		
9	SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed		
10	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.		
11	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.		

#### Report Title:

Administrative Penalties; Stony Coral and Live Rock Damage

#### Description:

Imposes administrative fines for intentional damage to stony coral and live rock based on a flat rate of \$10,000 per square meter or the value of the damaged area based on an accepted economic valuation method. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)
