A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

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PART I

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State has a
responsibility to conserve and protect agricultural lands,
promote diversified agriculture, increase agricultural selfsufficiency, and ensure the availability of agriculturally
suitable lands that is mandated by article XI, section 3, of the
state constitution.

8 The legislature passed Act 183, Session Laws of Hawaii 9 2005, which provided a framework to designate important 10 agricultural lands after appropriate incentives are established. 11 This process may take several more years. Meanwhile, many 12 agricultural lands that would be considered important 13 agricultural lands are currently available for sale, including 14 land in the Kunia area on Oahu.

Agricultural lands of Oahu, which has the highest population in the State, are under extreme development pressure. Thousands of agricultural acres in the Ewa plain are already

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converted or destined to be converted to urban needs. However,
 residents of Ewa and central Oahu have indicated in their
 sustainable community plans their desire to maintain an
 agricultural area.

5 There is an area of approximately 8,000 contiguous acres of 6 valuable Hawaii farmland in the Ewa, central Oahu area being 7 purchased by companies which will provide for a diverse mix of 8 farming operations accommodating large and small operations. 9 Most importantly, the land owner has indicated a willingness to contribute to the Hawaii Agriculture Research Center 10 11 approximately one hundred nineteen acres of land and 12 improvements, including agricultural worker housing and existing facilities for agricultural offices and agribusinesses. 13

14 The Hawaii Farm Bureau Federation, Hawaii Agriculture 15 Research Center, the Agricultural Leadership Foundation of 16 Hawaii, and the Landscape Industry Council of Hawaii are interested in co-locating their operations at this site to share 17 18 business-related resource needs. The University of Hawaii 19 college of tropical agriculture and human resources is also 20 interested in using this site for its agricultural business incubator, its Poamoho field station, and some of its extension 21 22 service office needs.

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1 Various agribusinesses have also expressed an interest in 2 having long term leases and locating and expanding their 3 businesses at this location. 4 There is presently a rare opportunity to develop an 5 agricultural business complex where existing agriculturally-6 based businesses can develop further, while new agricultural 7 businesses can be incubated and provided the support to develop. 8 Entrepreneurs would be encouraged to build agricultural 9 businesses if an agribusiness incubator is located near their 10 property to provide needed assistance and to identify, test, and 11 develop new agribusiness products. 12 The development of new agricultural businesses, supporting 13 infrastructure, and resulting agricultural products would

14 increase agricultural employment to support the existing15 agricultural rental housing already located within this area.

16 The legislature finds that the synergies provided by the 17 abovementioned programs of the University of Hawaii college of 18 tropical agriculture and human resources co-locating at the 19 Kunia site will further the State's goals of promoting 20 diversified agriculture and increased agricultural self-21 sufficiency.

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1	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general		
2	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so		
3	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 to		
4	cover expenses incurred by the University of Hawaii college of		
5	tropical agriculture and human resources to move the		
6	agribusiness incubator and Poamoho station projects and		
7	personnel to the Kunia site.		
8	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of		
9	Hawaii for the purposes of this part.		
10	PART II		
11	SECTION 3. The Komohana agricultural complex in Hilo is		
12	currently under renovation. As a result of steep, unforeseen		
13	escalations in the cost of labor and materials to bring older		
14	buildings into compliance with current seismic codes, funds		
15	budgeted are insufficient to fund the renovation of the		
16	administrative building.		
17	The purpose of this part is to enable the completion of		
18	renovations at the complex by appropriating funds for:		
19	(1) Remodeling antiquated offices, laboratories, and		
20	conference rooms;		
21	(2) Bringing the facility into compliance with the		
22	requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act;		
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1	(3)	Fixing or replacing a poorly designed and persistently	
2		<pre>leaking roof;</pre>	
3	(4)	Replacing a failing air conditioning system that is	
4		plagued by mold;	
5	(5)	Upgrading structural walls to meet current seismic	
6		code requirements; and	
7	(6)	Updating obsolete fire alarm, telephone, and	
8		electrical systems.	
9	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general		
10	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so	
11	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for		
12	the completion of renovations of the Komohana agricultural		
13	complex.		
14	The	sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of	
15	Hawaii for the purposes of this part.		
16	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
