## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE ACCIDENTS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 291C-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "§291C-13 Accidents involving damage to vehicle or
- 4 property. (a) The driver of any vehicle involved in an
- 5 accident resulting only in damage to a vehicle or other property
- 6 that is driven or attended by any person shall immediately stop
- 7 [such] the vehicle at the scene of the accident or as close
- 8 thereto as possible[7] as provided in subsection (b), but shall
- 9 forthwith return to, and in every event shall remain at, the
- 10 scene of the accident until the driver has fulfilled the
- 11 requirements of section 291C-14. Every such stop shall be made
- 12 without obstructing traffic more than is necessary.
- 13 (b) For purposes of subsection (a) the driver or attending
- 14 person shall move the vehicle, if the vehicle is operable so as
- 15 to be driven safely, and stop at a location of safety completely
- 16 or partially off the road, street, or highway, so as not to
- 17 obstruct traffic; provided that the driver can determine a safe
- 18 location to stop the vehicle."

Motor Vehicle Accident; Traffic Safety

## Description:

Requires the driver or attending person of a vehicle involved in a motor vehicle accident that involves only damage to the vehicle or other property, to drive a safely operable vehicle a safe place nearest the scene so as not to obstruct traffic. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)
