## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CIVIL DEFENSE DIVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE TO CONDUCT A STUDY TO DETERMINE THE FEASIBILITY OF ALLOWING THE FACILITIES AT LUALUALEI, WHICH ARE OWNED BY THE UNITED STATES NAVY, TO BE USED AS AN EMERGENCY SHELTER FOR CIVILIANS.

WHEREAS, natural disasters appear to be increasing in
frequency and intensity; and

4 WHEREAS, the State must have a comprehensive emergency 5 preparedness program to mitigate hazards, enhance preparedness 6 for major disasters, and accelerate response and recovery when 7 disaster strikes; and

9 WHEREAS, current concerns and challenges for the State 10 Civil Defense are the lack of emergency spaces throughout the 11 State, evacuation of tourists and residents, evacuation of the 12 special needs population, special needs emergency shelters, and 13 the development and maintenance of plans, public awareness, and 14 involvement; and

16 WHEREAS, plans to protect the public health, safety, and 17 welfare during disasters caused by fire, flood, tidal wave, 18 earthquake, or other natural causes and enemy attack, sabotage, 19 and other hostile action must be made to ensure the ability for 20 people to move quickly and efficiently to safe shelters; and 21

WHEREAS, the communities of Waianae, Makaha, Makua, Honokai Hale, Nanakuli, and Lualualei have only one major roadway with which to enter or exit their districts and in a time of emergency this highway can easily become congested or even shut down completely; and





WHEREAS, shelters for the people on the west coast of Oahu 1 need to be in a close and convenient location, large enough to 2 handle evacuees from the area, and structurally able to bear the 3 brunt of disasters such as hurricanes; and 4 5 WHEREAS, about one thousand seven hundred acres at 6 Lualualei were taken from the Hawaiian Home Lands in 1930 and 7 1933 under federal executive orders when Hawaii was a territory 8 and turned over to the United States Navy for ammunition 9 storage; and 10 11 WHEREAS, within the valley at the base of the Waianae 12 13 Mountain range are two hundred sixty six underground and aboveground ammunition storage areas that make up the Lualualei Naval 14 Magazine; and 15 16 WHEREAS, the facilities in the Lualualei Naval Magazine may 17 make an ideal site for emergency shelters due to their location 18 and the structural integrity of the bunker-style storage areas; 19 now, therefore, 20 21 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 22 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 23 Session of 2008, the Senate concurring, that the Civil Defense 24 Division of the Department of Defense is requested to conduct a 25 study to determine the feasibility of allowing the facilities at 26 Lualualei, which are owned by the United States Navy, to be used 27 as an emergency shelter for civilians; and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the feasibility study should 30 examine: 31 32 Any necessary agreements between the State and the 33 (1)United States Navy; 34 35 The sufficiency and capacity of the facilities to (2)36 37 provide emergency shelter; 38 Logistical challenges to making all or part of the (3) 39 facilities available to civilians for use during an 40 emergency; 41 42 (4) Any costs involved; and 43 44

(5) Any other pertinent issues; and 1 2 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Civil Defense Division is 3 also requested to submit a report of its findings, including any 4 proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty 5 days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2009; and 6 7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 8 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Commander of the 9 United States Pacific Fleet, Hawaii's congressional delegation, 10 the Governor, and the State Adjutant General. 11
