A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR A STUDY ON TWENTY-FOUR-HOUR COVERAGE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. There is established a joint legislative study
- 2 group to investigate the issues involved in implementing twenty-
- 3 four-hour insurance coverage in Hawaii. The study group shall
- 4 address the means by which the State can combine prepaid health
- 5 care, temporary disability insurance, motor vehicle insurance,
- 6 and other related insurance systems in order to prevent
- 7 duplication of coverage and avoid delays in the delivery of
- 8 health care. The study group shall specifically address the
- 9 issue of allowing an employee to access medical services through
- 10 the routes normally used under prepaid health care for services
- 11 covered by other forms of health benefits plans, such as
- 12 workers' compensation and motor vehicle insurance.
- 13 The study group shall develop initiatives to effectuate
- 14 twenty-four-hour coverage, including recommended statutory
- 15 changes to the federal Employee Retirement Income Security Act.
- 16 The study group shall be exempt from chapter 92, Hawaii
- 17 Revised Statutes. The members of the study group shall be

- 1 appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives and the
- 2 president of the senate. The chairs of the house committee on
- 3 labor and public employment and the senate committee on
- judiciary and labor shall serve as co-chairs of the study group. 4
- Members of the study group shall include: 5
- 6 The director of labor and industrial relations or the (1)
- 7 director's designee;
- 8 (2) The director of commerce and consumer affairs or the
- 9 director's designee;
- 10 (3) The insurance commissioner or the commissioner's
- 11 designee; and
- 12 (4)Any other individuals deemed to have relevant
- 13 expertise and experience.
- 14 Members of the study group shall receive no additional
- 15 compensation for their services.
- The department of labor and industrial relations shall 16
- provide research, clerical, and technical support for the study 17
- 18 group.
- 19 The study group shall cease to exist on June 30, 2008.
- 20 SECTION 2. The study group shall submit findings and
- 21 recommendations to the legislature not later than twenty days
- 22 before the convening of the regular session of 2008.

- 1 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$100,000, or so much
- 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, to
- 4 support the study group on twenty-four-hour coverage established
- 5 by this Act.
- 6 SECTION 4. The sum appropriated shall be expended by the
- 7 department of labor and industrial relations for the purposes of
- 8 this Act.
- 9 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
