A BILL FOR AN ACT

PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE XVI, SECTION 2, OF THE HAWAII CONSTITUTION TO PROVIDE FOR FORFEITURE OF RETIREMENT BENEFITS OF A MEMBER OF THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM WHO IS CONVICTED OF A FELONY FOR CONDUCT RELATED TO THE EMPLOYEE'S DUTIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to propose an
2	amendment to article XVI, section 2, of the Constitution of the
3	State of Hawaii to provide for forfeiture of retirement benefits
4	for members of the employees' retirement system who are
5	convicted of a felony.
6	SECTION 2. Article XVI, section 2, of the Constitution of
7	the State of Hawaii is amended to read as follows:
8	"EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM
9	Section 2. Membership in any employees' retirement system
10	of the State or any political subdivision thereof shall be a
11	contractual relationship, the accrued benefits of which shall
12	not be diminished or impaired [-], except that forfeiture of such
13	benefite may be as provided by law for conviction of a follow

1	SECTION 3. The question to be printed on the ballot shall
2	be as follows:
3	"Shall the retirement benefits of a public employee of the
4	state or county be forfeited for conviction of a felony for
5	conduct related to the duties of the employee, as may be
6	provided by law?"
7	SECTION 4. Constitutional material to be repealed is
8	bracketed and stricken. New constitutional material is
9	underscored.
10	SECTION 5. This amendment shall take effect upon
11	compliance with article XVII, section 3, of the Constitution of
12	the State of Hawaii.
