A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ELDERLY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that family caregiving
- 2 has always been a universal experience of all ethnicities,
- 3 lifestyles, and income levels, but recently, caregiving of
- 4 family elders has become more than an act of love and familial
- 5 responsibility. Due to a shortage of care providers in Hawaii,
- 6 family caregiving has become a critical element within the
- 7 State's health care and long-term care agendas.
- 8 Caregiving programs, such as the kupuna care program under
- 9 the department of health, provide various in-home services
- 10 (e.g., personal care, respite care, home delivered meals,
- 11 chores, attendant care, homemaker, etc.) and access services
- 12 (e.g., transportation, care management, escort, etc.) throughout
- 13 the State. These program services assist their clients with
- 14 managing and carrying out their daily needs, and provide their
- 15 clients' caregivers relief and more flexible schedules so that
- 16 they may take care of their own personal needs.

         The legislature further finds that some of these caregiving
    programs receive federal funding to maintain a variety of

    quality services that their clients and caregivers depend on on

    a daily-basis. Despite the success of these programs, federal
    funding cuts have been proposed, which may force some of these
5
    programs to seek alternative sources of funding to continue to
6
    meet their objectives, or may cause these programs financial
7
    disruption in their services and administration.

         The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to the
9
    counties as a grants-in-aid to financially assist caregiving
10
    programs that experienced federal funding cuts so they may
11
    continue to provide services to their clients and their clients'
