A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that currently, the
- 2 department of human services provides state-funded medical
- 3 assistance to children, of up to two hundred fifty per cent of
- 4 the federal poverty level, at no charge to a child's family.
- 5 Families that fall into the range of two hundred fifty to three
- 6 hundred per cent of the federal poverty level, are charged a
- 7 sliding scale premium for medical assistance for their children.
- 8 However, even these low cost premiums can pose a financial
- 9 hardship for some families.
- 10 Children who remain uninsured typically do not receive an
- 11 appropriate level of medical care. Children who lack a regular
- 12 source of medical care, or who must rely on receiving medical
- 13 care from a hospital emergency department, are unlikely to
- 14 receive preventive care or early and regular management of acute
- 15 or chronic health conditions.
- 16 Raising the eligibility threshold for children to receive
- 17 state-funded medical assistance to three hundred per cent of the

- 1 federal poverty level will enable close to two thousand children
- 2 to become eligible for medical assistance and will enable their
- 3 families to relinquish this financial burden.
- 4 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of
- 5 human services to provide state-funded medical assistance, of up
- 6 to three hundred per cent of the federal poverty level, to
- 7 persons less then nineteen years of age at no cost and to
- 8 appropriate funds for the provision of this additional medical
- 9 assistance.
- 10 SECTION 2. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 12 and to read as follows:
- 13 "§346- Medical assistance to children. (a) The
- 14 department shall provide state-funded medical assistance, of up
- 15 to three hundred per cent of the federal poverty level, at no
- 16 cost to persons less than nineteen years of age who are eligible
- 17 for benefits under the State's medicaid programs, including
- 18 QUEST and the State's children health insurance program."
- 19 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 20 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$4,600,000, or so
- 21 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and

- 1 the same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 2 year 2008-2009, for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 4 of human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
