#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

17		(C) Have had at least one year of experience in		
18		performing electrical maintenance work or proof		
19		of two years of schooling in the electrical

6	SECTION 2. Section 448E-5.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
7	amended to read as follows:		
8	"[+] §448E-5.5[+] Examination. (a) Every applicant shall		
9	be examined and shall pass an examination to be eligible for		
10	licensure. The board shall provide in its rules the passing		
11	score for the examination. The board may examine applicants or		
12	may contract with professional testing services to prepare,		
13	administer, and grade the examination as may be required for the		
14	purpose of this section.		
15	(b) Every applicant shall pay an examination fee as		
16	provided in rules adopted by the director pursuant to chapter		
17	91. Should the board contract with a professional testing		
18	agency to prepare, administer, and grade the examination, the		
19	examination fee may be paid directly to the testing agency by		
20	the director or the examinee.		
21	(c) The examinations for all levels of electricians shall		
22	test the applicant's knowledge of the principles of electrical		



- 1 theory and the requirements of the National Electrical Code.
- 2 The examinations shall test the applicant at the level of
- 3 knowledge gained through the successful completion of an
- 4 associate degree or certification program in electrical theory
- 5 or electrical apprenticeship from an accredited institution."
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 7 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 8 begun, before its effective date.
- 9 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
