## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HIGH CAPACITY AMMUNITION MAGAZINE FOR FIREARMS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 134-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "§134-8 Ownership, etc., of automatic firearms, silencers,
- 4 etc., prohibited; penalties. (a) The manufacture, possession,
- 5 sale, barter, trade, gift, transfer, or acquisition of any of
- 6 the following is prohibited: assault pistols, except as
- 7 provided by section 134-4(e); automatic firearms; rifles with
- 8 barrel lengths less than sixteen inches; shotquns with barrel
- 9 lengths less than eighteen inches; cannons; mufflers, silencers,
- 10 or devices for deadening or muffling the sound of discharged
- 11 firearms; hand grenades, dynamite, blasting caps, bombs, or
- 12 bombshells, or other explosives; or any type of ammunition or
- 13 any projectile component thereof coated with teflon or any other
- 14 similar coating designed primarily to enhance its capability to
- 15 penetrate metal or pierce protective armor; and any type of
- 16 ammunition or any projectile component thereof designed or
- 17 intended to explode or segment upon impact with its target.
