A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CIVIL DEFENSE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The massive 6.7 earthquake off the coast of the
- 2 Big Island on October 15, 2006, caused several generators on
- 3 Oahu to shut down because of the shaking, setting off a chain of
- 4 events that led to an extended power outage for the whole
- 5 island. Most television and radio stations lost power, causing
- 6 an inability to transmit vital civil defense messages and other
- 7 public information. The legislature finds that the lack of
- 8 information caused a heightened public fear of the unknown.
- 9 The purpose of this Act is to require radio and television
- 10 stations to be equipped with emergency back up power in times of
- 11 power outages.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 128-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
- 14 and to read as follows:
- ""Power outage" means a failure in the supply of
- 16 electricity, including but not limited to a blackout, causing a
- 17 temporary cessation in the supply of power."

         SECTION 3. Chapter 128, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

    amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated

    and to read as follows:

         "§128- Power outage; duty of radio and television
 5
    stations; emergency power supply. (a) Beginning November 1,
 6
    2007, a radio or television station shall maintain an emergency
 7
    supply of electrical power, in the event of a power outage, to
 8
    enable the continuous transmission of civil defense broadcasts
 9
    and other public information during the power outage for at

    least a twenty-four hour period.

         (b) It is only a violation of this section if a television
12
    or radio station fails to transmit during an outage due to
13
    failure to install or maintain an emergency supply, or human
    error in failure to activate the system. Failure to transmit

    due to physical damage caused by the emergency is not a
16
    violation.

         (c) Notwithstanding section 128-33, a violation of this
18
    section shall be punishable by a fine of $1,000 for each day or
19
    fraction thereof, of the violation. The director of civil
20
    defense shall enforce this law."

Description:

Requires radio and television stations to maintain emergency electrical generators in times of power outages.
