A BILL FOR AN ACT

ESTABLISHING A COMMISSION TO PLAN FOR THE FIFTIETH ANNIVERSARY OF HAWAII STATEHOOD.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to create a
- 2 commission composed of members from a wide range of Hawaii's
- 3 communities to plan and coordinate the public celebration of the
- 4 fiftieth anniversary of Hawaii's admission to statehood in the
- 5 United States of America.
- 6 The legislature finds and declares that the appropriation
- 7 under this Act is in the public interest and would benefit the
- 8 residents of Hawaii.
- 9 SECTION 2.(a) There is established a temporary commission
- 10 to be known as the 50th Anniversary of Statehood commission
- 11 consisting of fifty-one members who shall be appointed by the
- 12 governor, without regard to section 26-34, Hawaii Revised
- 13 Statutes.
- 14 (b) The commission shall be placed within the office of
- 15 the governor for administrative purposes and shall cease to
- 16 exist after December 31, 2009.

         SECTION 3. The commission shall develop, plan, and
    coordinate various program activities to be scheduled to

    celebrate and commemorate the fiftieth anniversary of the
    admission of Hawaii to statehood, including a series of events

    scheduled for August 2009, and shall submit to the legislature,

    no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular

5	SECT	ION 4. Consistent with section 2 of this Act, the
6	commissio	n shall be thus composed:
7	(1)	The chair of the commission shall be appointed by the
8		governor. Members of the commission may elect any
9		subordinate officers as the commission deems
10		appropriate among the members but, at minimum, shall
11		elect a vice-chair, vice-chair for finance, and vice-
12		chair for events.
13	(2)	All members of the commission serve at the pleasure of
14		the governor. In the event of a vacancy, the governor
15	,	may appoint a new member to fill the vacancy.
16	(3)	Commission members shall serve on a voluntary basis
17		without compensation, but shall be entitled to
18		reimbursement for necessary travel expenses for
19		attending commission meetings and while in the
20		discharge of their duties and responsibilities under
21		this Act.

1	SECTION 5. A two-thirds majority of commission members		
2	shall constitute quorum to do business and to validate any		
3	decision or act of the commission. The commission's meeting		
4	schedule shall be determined by the commission members.		
5	SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general		
6	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$250,000, or so much		
7	thereof as may be necessary, for fiscal year 2007-2008 to be		
8	used by the commission for the purposes of this Act.		
9	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of the		
10	governor.		
11	SECTION 7. Any provision of this Act to the contrary		
12	notwithstanding, the appropriation authorized under this Act		
13	shall not lapse of the end of the fiscal year for which the		
14	appropriation is made. The unexpended and unencumbered balance		
15	of the appropriation made in this Act as of the close of		
16	business on December 31, 2009, shall lapse.		
17	SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

TITLE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT ESTABLISHING A COMMISSION TO PLAN FOR THE FIFTIETH ANNIVERSARY OF

HAWAII STATEHOOD.

PURPOSE:

To plan and coordinate the celebration of the fiftieth anniversary of Hawaii's admission to statehood.

MEANS:

The Governor shall appoint a commission representing members from a wide range of Hawaii's communities, including business, unions, media, academia, government, culture and the arts, and community service to plan for and schedule a month-long series of events to take place during August 2009.

JUSTIFICATION:

Hawaii has benefited since its admission to the United States of America. The majority of visitors to Hawaii are from the United States of America. Tourism provides the backbone of Hawaii's economy, and statehood fosters tourism. Hawaii has also provided great advantage to the United States of America, with Hawaii's strategic location and gateway to the East. In turn, Hawaii and its people are fortunate to have the rights, privileges, and protections that come with statehood and citizenship.

Hawaii's residents are strongly patriotic, as evidenced by the public response to the September 11th attacks in 2001. Hawaii's residents are proud to be American and public celebrations of the fiftieth anniversary of Hawaii's admission to statehood would bring camaraderie, increased tourism, and enjoyment to visitors and residents alike.

Impact on the public: This bill will raise
awareness of Hawaii's role in the United



States of America and the world at large while giving the citizens of Hawaii and visitors opportunity to celebrate and reflect on the privileges of American citizenship.

Impact on the department and other agencies:

commission, this bill may require
coordination from the Department of
Accounting and General Services regarding
the use of certain State facilities.
