A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CRIMINAL TRESPASS IN THE SECOND DEGREE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	TION 1. The legislature finds that public housing
2	propertie	s administered by the Hawaii public housing authority
3	are consi	dered private residential properties for purposes of
4	criminal	law and face similar problems with trespassers. Many
5	times the	trespassers loiter, vandalize, and abuse alcohol on
6	public housing properties.	
7	SECT	ION 2. Section 708-814, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	amended to read as follows:	
9	"§70	8-814 Criminal trespass in the second degree. (1) A
10	person commits the offenses of criminal trespass in the second	
11	degree if:	
12	(a)	The person knowingly enters or remains unlawfully in
13		or upon premises that are enclosed in a manner
14		designed to exclude intruders or are fenced;
15	(b)	The person enters or remains unlawfully in or upon
16		commercial premises after a reasonable warning or
17		request to leave by the owner or lessee of the
18		commercial premises, the owner's or lessee's

i.	authorized agent, or a porice orricer; provided that
2	this paragraph shall not apply to any conduct or
3	activity subject to regulation by the National Labor
4	Relations Act[+];
5	[For purposes of this paragraph, "reasonable
6	warning or request" means a warning or request
7	communicated in writing at any time within a one year
8	period inclusive of the date the incident occurred,
9	which may contain but is not limited to the following
10	information:
11	(i) A warning statement advising the person that the
12	person's presence is no longer desired on the
13	property for a period of one year from the date
14	of the notice, that a violation of the warning
15	will subject the person to arrest and prosecution
16	for trespassing pursuant to section 708
17	814(1)(b), and that criminal trespass in the
18	second degree is a petty misdemeanor;
19	(ii) The legal name, any aliases, and a photograph, if
20	practicable, or a physical description, including
21	but not limited to sex, racial extraction, age,
22	height, weight, hair color, eye color, or any

2	person warned;
3	(iii) The name of the person giving the warning along
4	with the date and time the warning was given; and
5	(iv) The signature of the person giving the warning,
6	the signature of a witness or police officer who
7	was present when the warning was given and, if
8	possible, the signature of the violator; or]
9	(c) The person enters or remains on agricultural lands
10	without the permission of the owner of the land, the
11	owner's agent, or the person in lawful possession of
12	the land, and the agricultural lands:
13	(i) Are fenced, enclosed, or secured in a manner
14	designed to exclude intruders;
15	(ii) Have a sign or signs displayed on the unenclosed
16	cultivated or uncultivated agricultural land
17	sufficient to give notice and reading as follows:
18	"Private Property". The sign or signs,
19	containing letters not less than two inches in
20	height, shall be placed along the boundary line
21	of the land at roads and trails entering the land

1		in a manner and position as to be clearly
2		noticeable from outside the boundary line; or

4		person's presence is no longer desired on the property
5		for a period of one year from the date of the notice,
6		that a violation of the warning will subject the
7		person to arrest and prosecution for trespassing
8		pursuant to section 708-814(1)(b) or 708-814(1)(d),
9		and that criminal trespass in the second degree is a
10		<pre>petty misdemeanor;</pre>
11	<u>(b)</u>	The legal name, any aliases, and a photograph, if
12		practicable, or a physical description, including sex,
13		racial extraction, age, height, weight, hair color,
14		eye color, or any other distinguishing characteristics
15		of the person warned;
16	<u>(c)</u>	The name of the person giving the warning along with
17		the date and time the warning was given; and
18	<u>(d)</u>	The signature of the person giving the warning, the
19		signature of a witness or police officer who was
20		present when the warning was given, and if possible,
21		the signature of the violator.

- 3 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 4 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 5 begun, before its effective date.
- 6 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
