TITLE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE STATE RENT SUPPLEMENT PROGRAM.

PURPOSE:

To broaden participation in the State Rent Supplement Program by removing the statutory limitation on the subsidy amount (currently \$160 per month) and increasing the income limits for participation from 50 percent of area median income to 95 percent of area median income, as set by the Hawaii Public Housing Authority.

MEANS:

Amend sections 356D-151 and 356D-153, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION:

The State Rent Supplement Program (RSP) provides a shallow rent subsidy of up to \$160 per month to assist eligible households to rent a safe and decent dwelling unit in the private marketplace. The program, as originally conceived in 1967, was intended to assist "gap group" renter households who earned too much to qualify for federal rental assistance programs but too little to pay market rents. However, the RSP was revised by Act 214, Session Laws of Hawaii 2000, to limit participation to those earning up to 50 percent of the area median income established by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development - the same target group for federal public housing and Section 8 voucher programs.

Based on the rental market, households in this very low income group generally require deep subsidies. Under the Section 8 voucher program, the federal government provides a rental subsidy equivalent to 70 percent of the fair market rent. In the case of a one-bedroom unit in Honolulu, that subsidy is approximately \$590 per month. The RSP could assist a larger number of households in



today's housing market if the income limit for participation was increased to 95 percent of the area median income.

Impact on the public: Will increase the number of households eligible for rent supplement payments by approximately 200 additional households; allow HPHA to adjust the subsidy amount to reflect market conditions. Those who are currently on the waitlist (50% of area median income) will not lose their position on the waitlist.

Impact on the department and other agencies:
Increasing the income limits for
participation from 50 percent of area median
income to 95 percent of area median income;
to remove the statutory limitation on the
subsidy amount (currently \$160 per month).
