(a) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, a pharmacy or retailer may dispense, sell, or 9 distribute to a person without a prescription not more than 3.6 10 11 grams per day without regard to the number of transactions, of any product, mixture, or preparation containing any detectable 12 quantity of pseudoephedrine, its salts, optical isomers, or 13 salts of optical isomers, as the only active ingredient or in 14 combination with other active ingredients; provided that the 15 pharmacy or retailer complies with the following conditions: 16 The product, mixture, or preparation shall be (1)17 dispensed, sold, or distributed from an area not 18 accessible by customers or the general public, such as 19 behind the counter or in a locked display case and 20 where the seller delivers the product directly into 21 the custody of the purchaser; and 22

1	(2) Any person purchasing or otherwise acquiring any
2	product, mixture, or preparation shall:
3	(A) Produce proper identification containing the
4	photograph, printed name, and signature of the

A manufacturer 7 of a drug product may apply for removal of the product from this section if the product is determined by the administrator to have been formulated in such a way as to effectively prevent the 10 conversion of the active ingredient into methamphetamine. 11 [(d)] (c) Notwithstanding any other provision of this 12 chapter to the contrary, every wholesaler shall report to the 13 administrator all sales made to any retailer, of any product, 14 mixture, or preparation containing any detectable quantity of 15 pseudoephedrine, its salts, optical isomers, or salts of optical 16 isomers, as the only active ingredient or in combination with 17 other active ingredients. The department shall provide a common 18 reporting form that contains at least the following information 19 about the product, mixture, or preparation: 20 (1) Generic or other name; 21

JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT:

Public Safety

TITLE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES.

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this bill is to update chapter 329, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), to include new language and amendments made to the federal Controlled Substances Act relating to controlled substances and regulated chemicals to manufacture controlled substances.

MEANS:

Amend sections 329-14(e), 329-16,329-20(b), 329-22, and 329-75, HRS.

JUSTIFICATION:

Proposed amendments to chapter 329, HRS, will accomplish the following:

- (1) Update section 329-14(e), HRS to be consistent with federal law by adding the category heading "depressants" to section 329-14(e) Schedule I controlled substances having a depressant effect on the central nervous system.
- (2) Update section 329-16, HRS to include language and descriptions of controlled substances to be consistent with federal law.
- (3) Update section 329-20(b), HRS to include language and descriptions of controlled substances to be consistent with federal law.
- (4) Proposed amendment to section 329-22(b), HRS, will add the depressant drug Pregabalin [(S)-3-(aminomethyl)-5-methlhexanoic acid] to Schedule V, as required by section 329-11(d), HRS.
- (5) Proposed amendment to section 329-75,
 HRS, to remove the exemption for
 pseudoephedrine over the counter
 products that are packed in gel caps or
 liquids is necessary due to language in
 the federal Combat Methamphetamine Act
 of 2005, as required by section 32961(c), HRS.

Impact on the public: Allows the public to utilize the controlled substance Pregablin and makes Hawaii's controlled substance laws consistent with that of federal law.

Impact on the department and other agencies:
The proposed amendment will assist Narcotics
Enforcement Division in clarifying
regulations of the Uniform Controlled
Substances Act.
