## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that our democratic
2	process is based upon citizen participation. The founders of
3	our nation agreed that democracy could only be maintained though
4	an educated and informed citizenry. The legislature further
5	finds Hawaii school children should understand the electoral
6	process and possess a sense of civic responsibility that will
7	hopefully carry forward into their adulthood. It is imperative
8	to encourage and support educational programs that will educate
9	Hawaii's youngest citizens about state government and the state
10	legislative process. The legislature further finds that
11	requiring the assessment and tracking of students' development
12	of civic responsibility will enhance educational accountability.
13	The purpose of this Act is to:
14	(1) Establish a grant program in the department of
15	education to develop K-12 lesson plans, curriculum,
16	and other educational materials for civic
17	responsibility; and

1	(2)	Directly support the development of civic
2		responsibility in students by appropriating funds for
3		social studies textbooks; provided that the school
4	r	complex provides a plan or makes a declaration to the
5		department of education evidencing the importance of

8		further provided that the civic responsibility
9		curriculum is aligned within the school complex.

16	Expenditu	res shall be subject to the allotment and expenditure
17	plan requ	ired under section 37-34.5.
18	(b)	Grants shall be for the purposes of funding civic
19	responsib	ility education lesson plans, curriculum, and other
20	related e	ducational materials; provided that all such materials
21	shall be	aligned within the school complex.

There is appropriated out of the general 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ , or so 3 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and 4 the same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 5 year 2008-2009, for the civic responsibility education grant 6 program. 7 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department of education for the purposes of this section. 8 9 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and 11 12 the same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009, to purchase social studies textbooks for 13 14 schools; provided that the school complex provides a plan or makes a declaration to the department of education evidencing 15 16 the importance of civic responsibility and lists the textbooks 17 and other learning materials needed to educate students about civic responsibility; and further provided that the civic 18 19 responsibility curriculum is aligned within the school complex. 20 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 21 of education for the purposes of this section.
  - SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.

### Report Title:

Education; Civic Responsibility, Textbooks; Appropriation

#### Description:
