A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that our democratic			
2	process is based upon citizen participation. The founders of			
3	our nation agreed that democracy could only be maintained though			
4	an educated and informed citizenry. The legislature further			
5	finds that Hawaii school children should understand the			
6	electoral process and possess a sense of civic responsibility			
7	that will hopefully carry forward into adulthood. It is			
8	imperative to encourage and support educational programs that			
9	will educate Hawaii's youngest citizens about state government			
10	and the state legislative process. The legislature further			
11	finds that requiring the assessment and tracking of students'			
12	development of civic responsibility will enhance educational			
13	accountability.			
14	The purpose of this Act is to:			
15	(1) Establish a grant program in the department of			

education to develop K-12 lesson plans, curriculum,

1		and other educational materials on civic
2		responsibility; and
3	(2)	Directly support the development of civic
4		responsibility in students by appropriating funds for
5		social studies textbooks; provided that each school
6		complex provides a plan or makes a declaration to the
7		department of education evidencing the importance of
8		civic responsibility and lists the textbooks needed to
9		educate students about civic responsibility; and
10		provided further that the civic responsibility
11		curriculum is aligned within the school complex.
12	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended by	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated
14	and to re	ad as follows:

         The panel shall review proposals and make recommendations
    to the superintendent on grant awards. Panel members shall

    serve for a term of two years without compensation, but shall be
    entitled to reimbursement for necessary expenses, including
