A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CRIMINAL TRESPASS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 708-814, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by amending subsection (1) to read as follows:
- 3 "(1) A person commits the offense of criminal trespass in
- 4 the second degree if:
- 5 (a) The person knowingly enters or remains unlawfully in
- 6 or upon premises that are enclosed in a manner
- 7 designed to exclude intruders or are fenced;
- 8 (b) The person enters or remains unlawfully in or upon
- 9 commercial premises [or public property] after a
- 10 reasonable warning or request to leave by the owner or
- 11 lessee of the commercial premises [or public
- 12 property, or the owner's or lessee's authorized
- agent $[\tau]$ or [a] police officer; provided that this
- paragraph shall not apply to any conduct or activity
- 15 subject to regulation by the National Labor Relations
- 16 Act.

2	"rea	sonable warning or request" means a warning or	
3	requ	request communicated in writing at any time within a	
4	one-	one-year period inclusive of the date the incident	
5	occi	occurred, which may contain but is not limited to the	
6	foll	following information:	
7	(i)	A warning statement advising the person that the	
8		person's presence is no longer desired on the	
9		property for a period of one year from the date	
10		of the notice, that a violation of the warning	
11		will subject the person to arrest and prosecution	
12		for trespassing pursuant to section	
13		708-814(1)(b), and that criminal trespass in the	
14		second degree is a petty misdemeanor;	
15	(ii)	The legal name, any aliases, and a photograph, if	
16		practicable, or a physical description, including	
17		but not limited to sex, racial extraction, age,	
18		height, weight, hair color, eye color, or any	
19		other distinguishing characteristics of the	
20		person warned;	
21	(iii)	The name of the person giving the warning along	
22		with the date and time the warning was given; and	

1	(iv) The signature of the person giving the warning,
2	the signature of a witness or police officer who
3	was present when the warning was given and, if
4	possible, the signature of the violator."
5	SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
6	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
7	begun, before its effective date.
8	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
9	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
10	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Criminal Trespass; Illegal Campers or Squatters

Description:

Repeals the offense of criminal trespass in the second degree that prohibits persons from entering or remaining unlawfully on public property for a specified time period.
