A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE JUDICIARY AND FAMILY COURT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that some seventy per
- 2 cent of the State of Hawaii's population resides on Oahu, and is
- 3 serviced by the first judicial circuit consisting of twenty-five
- 4 (authorized) circuit court judges. The remaining thirty per
- 5 cent of Hawaii's population is serviced by the second judicial
- 6 circuit (Maui), with four circuit court judges; the third
- 7 judicial circuit (Hawaii), with four circuit court judges; and
- 8 the fifth judicial circuit (Kauai), with two circuit court
- 9 judges. The citizens of central and leeward Oahu, representing
- 10 twenty-two per cent of the State's population (thirty per cent
- 11 of Oahu's population), have no dedicated circuit court.
- 12 The legislature is committed to support the anticipated
- 13 continued growth of central and leeward Oahu with the creation
- 14 of a "second city" in Kapolei.
- 15 Consistent with that vision, the legislature in the 2005
- 16 session supported the judiciary's request for the construction
- 17 of a courthouse complex in Kapolei. The legislature's concern

- 1 over the most efficient way to provide equal access to justice,
- 2 promote the most effective delivery of legal services, and
- 3 better serve the needs of the entire population of Oahu leads to
- 4 the inevitable conclusion that the creation of an additional
- 5 circuit, to be designated the fourth circuit and located in the
- 6 Kapolei court complex, will best accomplish those goals.
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 571-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 "§571-3 Family courts, divisions of circuit courts. The
- 10 family courts shall be divisions of the circuit courts of the
- 11 State and shall not be deemed to be other courts as that term is
- 12 used in the [State Constitution] state constitution. A family
- 13 court shall be held at the courthouse in each circuit, or other
- 14 duly designated place, by the judge or judges of the respective
- 15 family courts as herein defined. The chief justice of the
- 16 supreme court may temporarily assign a family court judge to
- 17 preside in another circuit when the urgency of one or more cases
- 18 requires the chief justice to do so. The first circuit shall
- 19 retain all matters in the present location within the
- 20 jurisdiction of the family court as set forth in chapters 571,
- 21 580, 585, and 587, except proceedings under section 571-11(1)
- 22 may be held exclusively in the fourth circuit. In any case in

- 1 which it has jurisdiction the court shall exercise general
- 2 equity powers as authorized by law."
- 3 SECTION 3. Section 571-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 "§571-4 Family courts, circuits. In the first circuit any
- 6 judge or judges so designated by the chief justice of the
- 7 supreme court shall be the judge or judges of the family court
- 8 of the first circuit. The several judges of the second, third,
- 9 fourth, and fifth circuits, and of any other circuits hereafter
- 10 created by the legislature, shall, when exercising jurisdiction
- 11 under this chapter, be judges of the family courts of their
- 12 respective circuits. In any circuit in which more than one
- 13 judge is authorized to exercise jurisdiction as judge of the
- 14 family court, the chief justice of the supreme court shall
- 15 designate one of the judges as senior judge.
- 16 Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to limit the
- 17 jurisdiction and authority of any circuit judge, designated as
- 18 judge of a family court, to matters within the scope of this
- 19 chapter."
- 20 SECTION 4. Section 571-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 21 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

1 "(a) In addition to the district courts established under section 604-1, there may be established in each of the judicial 2 circuits of the State a district family court with the powers 3 4 and under the conditions herein set forth [which] that shall be 5 styled as follows: 6 (1) For the first judicial circuit: The district family 7 court of the first circuit. 8 (2) For the second judicial circuit: The district family 9 court of the second circuit. (3) For the third judicial circuit: The district family **10** 11 court of the third circuit. 12 (4) For the fourth judicial circuit: The district family 13 court of the fourth circuit. $[\frac{4}{4}]$ (5) For the fifth judicial circuit: The district 14 family court of the fifth circuit." 15 SECTION 5. Section 571-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is **16** 17 amended to read as follows: "§571-14 Jurisdiction; adults. (a) Except as provided in 18 sections 603-21.5 and 604-8, the court shall have exclusive 19 20 original jurisdiction: 21 [(1) To try any offense committed against a child by the 22 child's parent or guardian or by any other person

- 4 SECTION 9. There is appropriated out of the general
- 5 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so
- 6 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, for
- 7 the implementation of this Act.
- 8 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the judiciary for
- 9 the purposes of this Act.
- 10 SECTION 10. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 12 SECTION 11. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
