A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COUNTIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 46-72, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	"§46-72 Liability for damages; notice of injuries. Before
4	the county shall be liable for damages to any person for
5	injuries to person or property received upon any of the streets,
6	avenues, alleys, sidewalks, or other public places of the
7	county, or on account of any negligence of any official or
8	employee of the county, within two years after the injuries
9	occurred, the person [so] injured, or the owner or person
10	entitled to the possession, occupation, or use of the property
11	[so] injured, or someone [$\frac{in}{n}$] on the person's behalf, shall[τ
12	within six months after the injuries are received,] give the
13	individual identified in the respective county's charter, or if
14	none is specified, then the chairperson of the council of the
15	county or the [city] clerk of [Honolulu] the county in which the
16	injuries occurred, notice in writing of the injuries and the
17	specific damages resulting, stating fully [in the notice] when,

- 1 where, and how the injuries occurred, the extent [thereof,] of
- 2 the injuries, and the amount claimed [therefor]."
- 3 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 4 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 5 begun, before its effective date.
- 6 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

8 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Torts; Counties, Notice of Claim

Description:

Extends statute of limitation for actions against a county for damage or injury from 6 months to 2 years. Permits the counties to identify, by charter, the person to whom claimant should give notice of claim for injuries or damage sustained on public property or as a result of the negligence of county official or employee.
