

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE PHARMACY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 346-341, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by repealing the definition of "full coverage
3	prescription drug benefit".
4	[""Full coverage prescription drug benefit" means a
5	federally approved prescription drug plan that offers a zero co
6	payment benefit for medicaid dual eligibles under the medicare
7	<pre>part D drug benefit."]</pre>
8	SECTION 2. Section 346-342, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
10	"(b) The department [may] shall provide enrollment
11	assistance to eligible individuals [into the state pharmacy
12	assistance program. Enrollment for medicaid dual eligible
13	persons shall begin no later than October 1, 2005.] by:
14	(1) Identifying the medicare prescription drug plans that
15	best meet the needs of the enrollee at the lowest
16	cost, based on the enrollee's medication, pharmacy,
17	and overall costs; and

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

2	alternative medications available from the medicare
3	prescription drug plan would be less effective than
4	the prescribed medication or unsafe. The department
5	may seek reimbursement from the medicare prescription
6	drug plan and request and appeal a part D formulary
7	exception on behalf of the department and the
8	beneficiary.
9	(b) For persons meeting the eligibility requirements in
10	section 346-343 with household incomes between one hundred fifty
11	and two hundred fifty per cent of the federal poverty level, the
12	state pharmacy assistance program shall pay a portion of the
13	payment of medicare part D on a sliding scale of between twenty-
14	five per cent and one hundred per cent of the average premium
15	charged by the medicare prescription drug plans available in the
16	state.
17	[(b)] <u>(c)</u> The state pharmacy assistance program is the
18	payor of last resort [subject to the sufficiency of funds in the
19	state pharmacy assistance program special fund, as determined by
20	the department].
21	[(e)] (d) The state pharmacy assistance program shall be
22	funded with state appropriations [, including funds derived from

1 revenues to the State from rebates paid by pharmaceutical manufacturers pursuant to section 346 342(g), and with savings 2 resulting from medicare prescription drug coverage for the 3 medicaid dual eligible population." 4 5 SECTION 5. Section 346-345, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 6 7 Moneys in the state pharmacy assistance program special fund may be used for: 8 9 (1) Reimbursement payments to participating pharmacies for co-payments required under the federal medicare part D 10 11 pharmacy benefit program as provided to state pharmacy 12 assistance program participants;] 13 (1) Payment of benefits under section 346-344; 14 (2) The costs of administering the state pharmacy assistance program, including salary and benefits of 15 employees, computer costs, and contracted services as 16 17 provided in section 346-342(d); and Any other purpose deemed necessary by the department 18 (3)19 for the purpose of operating and administering the state pharmacy [assistance] program. 20 21 All interest on special fund balances shall accrue to the special fund. - 4 amended by amending section 6 to read as follows:

- 6 provided that section 3 shall take effect on [July 1,] June 30,
- 7 2007."
