A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HYPNOTHERAPY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the dictionary of
- 2 occupational titles, of the United States Department of Labor,
- 3 properly lists hypnotherapy as a profession separate and
- 4 independent of psychiatry or psychology. The legislature
- 5 further finds that the national center of educational
- 6 statistics, of the United States Department of Education
- 7 assigned a classification of instructional programs number to
- 8 hypnotherapy under the human services classification in the
- 9 health sciences and human services division.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to recognize hypnotherapy as a
- 11 legal profession and a provider of human services separate and
- 12 independent of psychiatry and/or psychology.
- 13 SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
- 14 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
- 15 as follows:

1	"CHAPTER
2	HYPNOTHERAPISTS
3	§ -1 Declaration of necessity for regulation and
4	control. The legislature finds that the practice of
5	hypnotherapy is a theory and method for treatment of illness and
6	disability and for strengthening and invigorating the body and
7	as such affects the public health, safety, and welfare,
8	therefore there is a necessity that individuals practicing
9	hypnotherapy be subject to regulation and control.
10	§ -2 Definitions. As used in this chapter:
11	"Board" means the board of hypnotherapy.
12	"Department" means the department of commerce and consumer
13	affairs.
14	"Director" means the director of commerce and consumer
15	affairs.
16	"Earned degree" means an academically or a clinically
17	obtained certificate (not honorary).
18	"Hypnotherapist" means a person engaged in the practice of
19	hypnotherapy.
20	"Practice of hypnotherapy" means the practice of employing
21	the controlled inducement of altered states of consciousness, or
22	trance, to reduce pain, resolve emotional conflicts, and enhance
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- 1 communications as part of diagnostic and treatment programs,
- 2 which includes instruction in the principles of hypnosis and
- 3 suggestion, induction and deepening, post-hypnotic suggestion,
- 4 awakening techniques, regression, pacing, and leading,
- 5 resistance transformation, and client testing.
- 6 § -3 License required. Except as otherwise provided by
- 7 law, no person shall practice hypnotherapy in this State either
- 8 gratuitously or for pay, or shall offer to so practice, or shall
- 9 announce themselves either publicly or privately as prepared or
- 10 qualified to so practice any method of hypnotherapy without
- 11 having a valid unrevoked license.
- 12 § -4 Physicians, chiropractors, and osteopaths not
- 13 exempt. Persons licensed under chapters 442, 453, and 460 who
- 14 desire to practice hypnotherapy shall be subject to licensing
- 15 under this chapter.
- 16 § -5 Exemptions. A licensed hypnotherapist of another
- 17 state or country for demonstrations or lectures to be given at
- 18 hypnotherapy or medical society meetings or at hypnotherapy
- 19 schools shall be exempt from licensing procedures set forth in
- 20 this chapter.
- 21 § -6 Qualifications for examination. (a) No person
- 22 shall be licensed to practice hypnotherapy unless the person has

- (b) Prior to September 1, 2007, and except as provided in subsection (c), before any applicant shall be eligible for the examination, the applicant shall furnish satisfactory proof to the board that the applicant has received a total of not less than one thousand five hundred hours of education and training consisting of:
- 10 (1) A formal program in the science of hypnotherapy at an institute or school approved by the board that:
 - (A) Shall be for a period of not less than six months (not less than three hundred hours); and
 - (B) Shall result in the award of a certificate or diploma; and
 - (2) Six months clinical internship program (not less than six months; and not less than three hundred hours) supervised by a licensed hypnotherapist; provided that the three hundred hours of the clinical internship program may be obtained from the institute or school awarding the certificate or diploma or may be obtained

1 under the supervision of a licensed hypnotherapist not affiliated with an institute or school. 2 3 (c) Students who started training prior to September 1, 1995, and who have been certified for five of ten years in a 4 5 school approved by the board, for the purposes of this chapter 6 shall: Not lose their rights of continued education, earned 7 (1)or accumulated credits; and 8 9 (2) Meet requirements for examination and licensure as provided by law and rules adopted by the board; 10 11 provided that the school has not altered its program so as to lower the standards for completion of the 12 13 program. 14 Students who file an application with the board before (d) September 1, 2007 shall: 15 Not lose their rights of continued education, and 16 (1)17 earned or accumulated credits; and 18 Notwithstanding subsections (b) and (c), effective (d) September 1, 2007, before any applicant shall be eligible for 19 20 the examination, the applicant shall furnish satisfactory proof to the board that the applicant has completed a formal 21

- 2 of an academic program of not less than three hundred hours in
- 3 hypnotherapy and a clinical training program of not less than
- 4 three hundred hours under the supervision of a licensed
- 5 hypnotherapist, which shall result in the award of a certificate
- 6 or diploma at an institute, school, or college, accredited or
- 7 recognized as a candidate for accreditation by any hypnotherapy
- 8 accrediting body recognized by the United States Department of
- 9 Education or at a foreign institute, school, or college with a
- 10 formal program in the science of hypnotherapy licensed,
- 11 approved, or accredited by the appropriate governmental
- 12 authority or an agency recognized by a governmental authority in
- 13 that jurisdiction and whose curriculum is approved by the board.
- 14 § -7 Board of hypnotherapy. There shall be a board of
- 15 hypnotherapy, the members of which shall be appointed by the
- 16 governor.
- 17 The board shall consist of five persons, two of whom shall
- 18 be private citizens and three shall be hypnotherapists licensed
- 19 in accordance with this chapter.
- 20 § -8 Powers and duties of the board. In addition to
- 21 any other powers and duties authorized by law, the board shall:

1	(1)	Adopt rules in accordance with chapter 91 to carry out
2		the purposes of this chapter, with special emphasis on
3		the health and safety of the public;
4	(2)	Develop standards for licensure;
5	(3)	Prepare, administer, and grade examinations, provided
6		that the board may contract with a testing agency to
7		provide those services;
8	(4)	Issue, renew, suspend, and revoke licenses;
9	(5)	Register applicants or holders of a license;
10	(6)	Investigate and conduct hearings regarding any
11		violation of this chapter and any rules of the board;
12	(7)	Maintain a record of its proceedings; and
13	(8)	Do all things necessary to carry out the functions,
14		powers, and duties set forth in the chapter.
15	§	-9 Biennial renewal. Every person holding a license
16	under thi	s chapter shall register with the board and pay a
17	biennial	fee on or before June 30 of each odd-numbered year.
18	Failure t	o pay the biennial fee shall constitute a forfeiture of
19	the licen	se as of the date of expiration. Any license so
20	forfeited	may be restored within one year after the expiration
21	upon fili	ng of an application and payment of a restoration fee.

1	S	-10 Revocation or suspension of licenses. In
2	addition	to any other actions authorized by law, any license to
3	practice :	hypnotherapy under this chapter may be revoked or
4	suspended	by the board of hypnotherapy at any time in a
5	proceeding	g before the board for any cause authorized by law,
6	including	but not limited to the following:
7	(1)	Obtaining a fee on the assurance that a manifestly
8		incurable ailment can be permanently cured;
9	(2)	The use of false, fraudulent, or deceptive advertising
10		and making untruthful and improbable statements;
11	(3)	Habitually using any habit forming controlled
12		substance, such as opium or any of its derivatives,
13		morphine, heroin, or cocaine;
14	(4)	Procuring a license through fraud, misrepresentation,
15		or deceit;
16	(5)	Professional misconduct or gross carelessness or
17		manifest incapacity in the practice of hypnotherapy;
18		or
19	(6)	Violating any rules adopted under this chapter.
20	\$	-11 Penalty. (a) Any person except a person
21	licensed w	under this chapter who practices, treats, or instructs
22	in any pha	ase of hypnotherapy without a license or permit issued
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- 1 by the board, or uses any word or title to induce the belief
- 2 that they are engaged in the practice of any type of
- 3 hypnotherapy, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and subject to a
- 4 fine of not less than \$50 nor more than \$1,000 for each
- 5 violation.
- 6 (b) Any person, except a licensed hypnotherapist, who:
- 7 (1) Practices or attempts to practice hypnotherapist;
- 8 (2) Buys, sells, or fraudulently obtains any diploma or
- 9 license to practice hypnotherapy whether recorded or
- 10 not;
- 11 (3) Uses the title "hypnotherapist", or any word or title
- to induce the belief that the person is engaged in the
- practice of hypnotherapy without complying with this
- 14 chapter; or
- 15 (4) Violates this chapter;
- 16 shall be penalized as provided in subsection (a). The
- 17 department may also seek all legal and equitable remedies
- 18 available to it for the enforcement of this chapter, including
- 19 seeking injunctive relief.
- 20 § -12 Foreign school curricula and standards. The
- 21 board of hypnotherapy shall not recognize and approve an earned
- 22 doctoral degree from a foreign university or college whose



- 1 curricula and standards are not equivalent to or higher than
- 2 institutions in the United States which have been recognized and
- 3 approved by the board in the study or practice of hypnotherapy."
- 4 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
