A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE TRAUMA SYSTEM SPECIAL FUND.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that trauma care in
- 2 Hawaii is in a state of crisis and recognizes that trauma care
- 3 is a public health priority.
- 4 Injury is the leading cause of death for persons between
- 5 the ages of one to forty-four in the State of Hawaii, causing
- 6 more deaths than are caused by cancer and heart disease
- combined. This underscores the seriousness of traumatic injury 7
- 8 as a public health problem in the State.
- 9 When injuries are serious, specialized equipment and prompt
- 10 access to physicians and other trained health care providers
- 11 make a significant difference in a trauma patient's health
- 12 outcome. A weak trauma system decreases the State's readiness
- 13 to respond not only to the normal flow of critically injured
- 14 patients, but to unforeseen disasters and emergencies as well.
- 15 As the American College of Surgeons noted in its October
- 16 2005 report, "Hawaii Trauma System Consultation," extreme
- 17 isolation and limited physician re-supply capability renders



- 1 Hawaii uniquely vulnerable to natural disasters that may occur
- 2 in a mid-pacific environment. A functional trauma system with
- 3 the capacity to handle a surge in demand is a fundamental
- 4 necessity in responding to both natural and man-made disasters.
- 5 Typically, the cost of providing care to trauma patients is
- 6 far higher than the total payments received from those patients.
- 7 Without additional resources, it is unlikely that Hawaii's trauma
- 8 system will increase in capacity and is at risk of losing what
- 9 specialized trauma care is currently available.
- 10 A January 2006, report by the legislative reference bureau
- 11 entitled, "On-Call Crisis in Trauma Care: Government
- 12 Responses, " noted that the rationale for public support of
- 13 uncompensated trauma services is the same as for critical police
- 14 and fire services; a trauma system is a necessary public service
- 15 that ought to be publicly supported.
- 16 In light of these findings, the legislature enacted Acts
- 17 305 and 316, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006, to ensure and
- 18 encourage the availability of trauma care in the State by
- 19 creating a trauma system special fund and dedicating a portion
- 20 of the revenues generated from cigarette and tobacco tax for the
- 21 trauma system special fund. However, under the terms of these
- 22 Acts, cigarette and tobacco tax revenues will not be deposited



- into the trauma system special fund until September 30, 2007, at
 the earliest.

 The legislature acknowledges that there is a desperate need
 to expand the resources available for trauma care in Hawaii. It
 is also evident that additional resources are needed immediately
- ${f 6}$ to ensure the health, welfare, and safety of the citizens of our
- 7 State. Accordingly, this Act provides a variety of mechanisms
- 8 to provide needed resources for Hawaii's trauma system.
- 9 Among other things, this Act:
- 10 (1) Establishes surcharges for violations of chapters 291
 11 (traffic violations), 291E (use of intoxicants while
 12 operating a vehicle), 706 (crimes of violence), and
 13 712, part IV (offenses related to drugs and
 14 intoxicating compounds);
- 15 (2) Establishes surcharges for violations of sections
 16 291C-12 (accidents involving death or serious bodily
 17 injury), 291C-12.5 (accidents involving substantial
 18 bodily injury), 291C-6 (accidents involving bodily
 19 injury), and 291C-161 (Statewide Traffic Code);
- 20 (3) Clarifies that the trauma system special fund consists
 21 of, among other things, trauma system surcharges, and
 22 cigarette tax revenues;

8	operation of a comprehensive state trauma system. The trauma		
9	system special fund shall be used to subsidize the documented		
10	costs for the comprehensive state trauma system, including but		
11	not limited to the following:		
12	(1) Costs of under-compensated and uncompensated trauma		
13	care incurred by hospitals providing care to trauma		
14	patients; and		
15	(2) Costs incurred by hospitals providing care to trauma		
16	patients to maintain on-call physicians for trauma		
17	care.		
18	The money in the trauma system special fund shall not be		
19	used to supplant funding for trauma services authorized prior to		
20	July 1, 2006, and shall not be used for ambulance or medical air		

transport services.

- 15 SECTION 10. There is appropriated out of the general
- 16 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so
- 17 much as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the sum
- 18 of \$, or so much as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 19 2008-2009, to subsidize the documented costs for the
- 20 comprehensive state trauma system, including the costs of under-
- 21 compensated and uncompensated trauma care incurred by hospitals
- 22 providing care to trauma patients and the costs incurred by



- 1 hospitals providing care to trauma patients to maintain on-call
- 2 physicians for trauma care.
- 3 The sums appropriated shall be deposited into the trauma
- 4 system special fund in accordance with section 321-22.5, Hawaii
- 5 Revised Statutes.
- 6 SECTION 11. There is appropriated out of the trauma system
- 7 special fund established in section 321-22.5, the sum of
- 8 \$, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 9 year 2007-2008, and the same sum, or so much thereof as may be
- 10 necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009, to subsidize the documented
- 11 costs for the comprehensive state trauma system, including the
- 12 costs of under-compensated and uncompensated trauma care
- 13 incurred by hospitals providing care to trauma patients and the
- 14 costs incurred by hospitals providing care to trauma patients to
- 15 maintain on-call physicians for trauma care.
- 16 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 17 of health for the purposes of this Act.
- 18 SECTION 12. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 19 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 20 SECTION 13. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;

- 1 provided that sections 10 and 11 shall take effect on July 1,
- 2 2007.

Description:

Establishes additional funding mechanisms for the trauma system special fund. Makes appropriations.
