A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BAIL ENFORCEMENT AGENTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Chapter 431, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 amended by adding a new article to be appropriately designated 2 and to read as follows: 3 "ARTICLE 4 5 BAIL ENFORCEMENT AGENTS PART I. GENERAL PROVISIONS §431: -101 Scope. This article shall govern the 7 qualifications and procedures for granting licenses to all bail 8 9 enforcement agents. \$431: -102 Definitions. As used in this article, unless 10 11 the context otherwise requires: "Bail enforcement agent" or "bounty hunter" means a person 12 who transacts the apprehension or surrender of a defendant in a 13 14 pending criminal case who has been released from custody under a financially secured appearance, cash, or other bond and has had 15 that bond declared forfeited, or a defendant in a pending 16 criminal case who has violated a bond condition whereby 17 apprehension and reincarceration are permitted. 18

3	§431: -201 License required; exception. No person
4	holding oneself out as a bail enforcement agent in this State
5	shall do so unless so licensed by this State.
6	§431: -202 General qualifications for license. For the
7	protection of the public, the commissioner shall not issue or
8	extend any license for a bail enforcement agent to any
9	individual:
10	(1) Less than eighteen years of age;
11	(2) Who has been convicted in any jurisdiction of a felony
12	involving:
13	(A) Theft;
14	(B) Unlawful use or possession of a deadly weapon or
15	dangerous instrument;
16	(C) Violence; or
17	(D) Unlawful use, possession, or sale of a narcotic
18	or other dangerous drug; or
19	(3) Who has been committed for a mental disorder to any
20	hospital, mental institution, or sanitarium and does
21	not possess a certificate from a physician that the
22	individual no longer suffers from the mental disorder

- such that the mental disorder would interfere with or prevent the individual from handling dangerous weapons.
- 4 §431: -203 Applications for license. (a) Application
- 5 for any such license shall be made to the commissioner upon
- 6 forms as prescribed and furnished by the commissioner.
- 7 (b) Each applicant for license as a bail enforcement agent
- 8 shall prior to the issuance of any such license, personally take
- 9 and pass an eight-hour criminal justice course administered or
- 10 approved by the commissioner.
- 11 (c) Each applicant for license as a bail enforcement agent
- 12 shall prior to the issuance of any such license, personally take
- 13 and pass to the satisfaction of the commissioner an examination
- 14 given by the commissioner as a test of the applicant's
- 15 qualifications and competence.
- (d) In addition, each applicant shall submit fingerprints
- 17 to the police of the county in which the individual resides and
- 18 shall provide the commissioner with consent to perform a
- 19 criminal history background check on the individual.
- 20 (e) Licenses issued under this article shall be subject to
- 21 renewal every three years upon the original issuance.
