A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII TOURISM AUTHORITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 201B-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsections (b), (c), and (d) to read as
3	follows:
4	"(b) The authority shall be headed by a policy-making
5	board of directors [which] that consists of twelve public,
6	voting members, and four ex officio nonvoting members; provided
7	that[+], notwithstanding section 26-34:
8	(1) [Twelve] <u>Two</u> public, voting members shall be appointed
9	by the governor as provided in section 26-34[, except
10	as otherwise provided by law]; provided that one shall
11	have knowledge, experience, and expertise in the area
12	of Hawaiian cultural practices;
13	(2) [The twelve] One public, voting [members] member shall
14	be [composed of at least one representative each from]
15	nominated separately and, by and with the advice and
16	consent of the Senate, appointed separately by each
17	mayor of the city and county of Honolulu and the

I		counties of Hawaii, Kauai, and Maui; [the remaining

14		representatives; [provided that if fewer than three
15		names are submitted for each appointment, the governor
16		may disregard the list;] provided that half of the
17		voting members shall have knowledge, experience, and
18		expertise in the area of visitor industry management,
19		marketing, promotion, transportation, retail,
20		entertainment, or visitor attractions; and provided
21		further that appointments by the president and the
22		speaker of the house of representatives shall be made

4		shall have knowledge, experience, and expertise in the

10		more than three members shall represent, be employed

13	(5)	The [governor shall make] appointments shall be made
14		to ensure the fulfillment of all requirements;
15		provided that any appointments made after July 1,
16		2002, shall be made to fulfill the requirements in
17		place when the appointments are made;
18	(6)	The director of business, economic development, and
19		tourism, or a designated representative, shall be an
20		ex officio nonvoting member;

1	(7)	The director of transportation, or a designated
2		representative, shall be an ex officio nonvoting
3		member;
4	(8)	The chairperson of the board of land and natural
5		resources, or a designated representative, shall be an
6		ex officio nonvoting member; and
7	(9)	The executive director of the state foundation on
8		culture and the arts, or a designated representative,
9		shall be an ex officio nonvoting member.
10	(c)	The public members shall be appointed by the governor
11	for terms	of four years[+], except as provided in subsection
12	(b)(2) and	d (3). Each public member shall hold office until the
13	member's	successor is appointed and qualified. Section 26-34
14	shall be a	applicable insofar as it relates to the number of terms
15	and consec	cutive number of years a member may serve on the board.

- 12 SECTION 2. Section 26-34, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended by amending subsection (e) to read as follows:
- 14 "(e) Except as otherwise provided by this chapter, this
- 15 section shall apply to every board and commission established by
- 16 part I, or existing or established after November 25, 1959. All
- 17 new appointments to any board or commission shall thereafter be
- 18 made in accordance with this section[-], except as provided in
- 19 section 201B-2."
