A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BUDGET TRANSPARENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that transparency and
- 2 accountability is crucial to the success of democracy, by
- 3 allowing citizens to watch over their elected leaders and
- 4 government agencies.
- 5 The legislature also finds that the budget is one of the
- 6 most important documents of government, as it allocates public
- 7 resources and expresses the priorities and values of the State.
- 8 Although the process of creating the state budget receives a
- 9 great deal of attention during the legislative session, there is
- 10 considerably less attention paid to ensuring that the budget is
- 11 executed as planned.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to provide greater transparency,
- 13 thereby helping to ensure accountability, improve public
- 14 confidence, and promote informed debate about fiscal matters, by
- 15 requiring reporting of information on appropriated funds
- 16 through:

1	(1)	Quarterly updates for program appropriations covering
2		the current biennium; and
3	(2)	Semi-annual updates for capital improvement
4		appropriations covering the current and previous
5		biennium, as well as an extended period for projects
6		with federal funding.
7	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 37, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
8	by adding	a new section to be appropriately designated and to
9	read as f	ollows:
10	" <u>§37</u>	- Budget and financial plan updates. (a) Any other
11	law to th	e contrary notwithstanding, the governor shall submit
12	updates t	o the two-year budget to the legislature pursuant to
13	sections	(b) and (c).
14	<u>(b)</u>	For program appropriations, quarterly updates shall be
15	reported	no later than fifteen days after the close of each
16	allotment	period. Reports shall cover the two fiscal years in
17	the curre	nt biennium and include:
18	(1)	The amounts appropriated for each program;
19	(2)	The actual expenditures for each program for the most
20		recent allotment periods; provided that an estimate of
21		the expenditures may be substituted if the actual

1		expenditures are not available at the time of the
2		report;
3	(3)	Identification of the programs for which the actual
4		expenditures for each fiscal year are anticipated to
5		be less than fifty per cent of the budgeted amount;
6		provided that a narrative explanation regarding the
7		reason for the deviation shall be included in the
8		report; and
9	(4)	Any changes made to figures or explanations in
10		previous reports.
11	(c)	For capital improvement project appropriations,
12	updates s	hall be reported semi-annually no later than April 15
13	and Octob	er 15. The April 15 report shall cover capital
14	improveme	nt project appropriations in the previous two biennia
15	and in th	e current biennium through March 31 of that fiscal
16	year. Th	e October 15 report shall cover capital improvement
17	projects	appropriations in the previous two biennia and in the
18	current b	iennium through September 30 of that fiscal year. The
19	reports s	hall include the following for each project:
20	(1)	The program ID, item number, and project title;
21	(2)	The amount of the appropriation and means of finance;

1	(3)	The amounts requested for afforment and the date
2		requested; provided that if no request has been
3		submitted, a narrative explanation regarding the
4		reason shall be included in the report;
5	(4)	The amounts allotted, expended, and encumbered;
6		provided that if allotment requests were denied or
7		only a partial allotment was made, a narrative
8		explanation regarding the reason shall be included in
9		the report; and
10	<u>(5)</u>	Any changes made to figures or explanations in
11		previous reports.
12	<u>(d)</u>	The reports shall be printed with a reasonable number
13	of copies	for public distribution, and shall be made available
14	on the web	osite of the ."
15	SECT	ON 3. Section 37-69, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16	amended by	amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
17	"(a)	The governor shall prepare a state six-year program
18	and financ	cial plan encompassing all state programs. Not fewer
19	than thirt	cy days before the legislature convenes in every odd-
20	numbered y	year, the governor shall submit to the legislature and
21	to each me	ember thereof the six-year program and financial plan.
22	The progra	am and financial plan shall be annually and continually

1	updated a	nd maintained. Quarterly updates of the financial plan
2	shall be	submitted to the legislature. The program and
3	financial	plan, in general, shall contain:
4	(1)	The state program structure;
5	(2)	Statements of statewide objectives and program
6		objectives;
7	(3)	Program plans that describe the programs recommended
8		to implement the statewide and program objectives and
9		the manner in which the recommended programs are
10		proposed to be implemented over the next six fiscal
11		years; and
12	(4)	A financial plan that shows the fiscal implications of
13		the recommended programs for the next six fiscal
14		years."
15	SECT	ION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
