A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT SECURITY LAW.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to create a self-1 employment assistance program within the department of labor and 2 industrial relations to provide unemployed individuals 3 assistance in starting their own businesses. Participation in 4 5 the self-employment assistance program shall be voluntary, as an alternative to receiving regular unemployment insurance 6 benefits. The self-employment assistance program will allow 7 8 eligible unemployed individuals to receive weekly unemployment insurance benefits while working full-time towards starting 9 their own businesses, rather than seeking employment. 10 SECTION 2. Chapter 383, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 12 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and 13 to read as follows: 14 SELF-EMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

§383-A Definitions. As used in this part:

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"Full-time basis" means devoting the specified amount of 1 2 time, as prescribed by the department, necessary for an individual to establish a business and become self-employed. 3 "Regular benefits" means benefits payable to an individual 4 under this chapter, including benefits payable to federal 5 6 civilian employees and to former members of the United States armed forces pursuant to the Title 5 U.S.C. Chapter 85, other 7 than additional benefits, extended benefits, and extended 8 benefits for dislocated workers. 9 10 "Self-employment assistance activities" means activities approved by the director in which an individual participates for 11 the purpose of establishing a business and becoming self-12 13 employed, including but not limited to: (1) Entrepreneurial training; 14 Business counseling; and (2) 15 Technical assistance. 16 (3)"Self-employment assistance allowance" means an allowance 17 payable, in lieu of regular benefits, funded by the unemployment 18 compensation fund to an individual who meets the requirements of 19 this part. 20 §383-B Self-employment assistance program. The department 21

shall establish a self-employment assistance program in

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1	accordanc	e with this part. Information on the self-employment
2	assistanc	e program shall be made available to potential program
3	participants.	
4	\$383	-C Self-employment assistance allowance; weekly
5	amount; m	aximum. (a) The weekly amount of the self-employment
6	assistanc	e allowance payable to an individual shall be equal to
7	the weekly benefit amount for regular benefits otherwise payabl	
8	under sec	tion 383-22. The self-employment assistance allowance
9	shall als	o be payable to an individual at the same intervals and
10	on the same terms and conditions as regular benefits, except as	
11	follows:	
12	(1)	The requirements of section 383-29(a), regarding being
13		available for work, actively seeking work, and
14		refusing to accept suitable work shall not be
15		applicable to the individual;
16	(2)	The requirements of section 383-23 regarding
17		remuneration for services performed shall not be
18		applicable to income earned from self-employment by
19		the individual;
20	(3)	The individual is considered unemployed for purposes
21		of section 383-29; and

1	(4)	If the individual fails to participate in self-	
2		employment assistance activities or fails to actively	
3		engage on a full-time basis in establishing a business	
4		and becoming self-employed the individual is	
5		ineligible to receive the self-employment assistance	
6		allowance for each week in which the failure occurs.	
7	(b)	The sum of the self-employment assistance allowances	
8	paid under	r this part and regular benefits paid under this	
9	chapter sl	hall not exceed the maximum amount of benefits	
10	established under section 383-24.		
11	§383·	-p Eligibility. (a) An individual shall be eligible	
12	to receive	e a self-employment assistance allowance if the	
13	individua	1:	
14	(1)	Is eligible to receive regular benefits or would be	
15		eligible to receive regular benefits except for the	
16		requirements described in section 383-C(a);	
17	(2)	Is identified under section 383-92.5 as an individual	
18		likely to exhaust regular benefits;	
19	(3)	Has filed an application for participation in the	
20		self-employment assistance program within sixty days	
21		of filing an initial claim for regular benefits and	

1		furnished the department with any other information
2		the director may prescribe;
3	(4)	Has, at the time the application is filed, a balance
4		of regular benefits equal to at least eighteen times
5		the individual's weekly benefits amount and at least
6		eighteen weeks remaining in the individual's benefit
7		year;
8	(5)	Has been accepted into a program approved by the
9		director that will provide self-employment assistance
10		activities;
11	(6)	Is participating in self-employment assistance
12		activities;
13	(7)	Is actively engaged on a full-time basis in
14		establishing a business and becoming self-employed;
15	(8)	Has not previously participated in a self-employment
16		assistance program; and
17	(9)	Has filed a weekly claim for the self-employment
18		assistance allowance and provided any information the
19		director prescribes, including a log of self-
20		employment assistance activities.
21	(b)	An individual who has received a self-employment
22	assistanc	e allowance under this part and is terminated or

- 1 voluntarily leaves a self-employed assistance program may
- 2 receive, if otherwise eligible, regular benefits with respect to
- 3 the benefit year; provided that the sum of regular benefits paid
- 4 and self-employment assistance allowances paid with respect to
- 5 the benefit year shall not exceed the maximum amount payable for
- 6 the benefit year under section 383-24.
- 7 §383-E Limitation. The total number of individuals
- 8 receiving a self-employment assistance allowance at any time
- 9 shall not exceed five per cent of the total number of
- 10 individuals receiving regular benefits at that time.
- 11 §383-F Costs. Any self-employment assistance allowance
- 12 paid under this part shall be charged to employers as regular
- 13 benefits in accordance with section 383-61.
- 14 §383-G Rules. The director may adopt rules in accordance
- 15 with chapter 91 to carry out the purposes of this Act.
- 16 §383-H Reports. The department shall report annually to
- 17 the legislature on the self-employment assistance program at
- 18 least twenty days prior to the convening of each regular
- 19 session. The reports shall include the following:
- 20 (1) The number of individuals participating in the self-
- 21 employment assistance program and the number of
- businesses developed thereunder;

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1	(2)	The cost of operating the program, compliance with
2		program requirements, and data related to business
3		income;
4	(3)	The number of employees and wages paid in the new
5	·	businesses;
6	(4)	The incidence and duration of unemployment after
7		business start-up; and
8	(5)	Any recommendations, including proposed legislation,
9		on changes to the program.
10	§383	-I Applicability. This part shall be effective for
11	the weeks	beginning after the date of enactment or after any
12	plan requ	ired by the United States Department of Labor is
13	approved,	whichever date is later. This part shall terminate as
14	of the ef	fective date of the withdrawal of approval of any plan
15	required by the United States Department of Labor or as of the	
16	week containing the date when federal law no longer authorizes	
17	self-employment assistance programs."	
18	SECT	ION 3. In codifying the new sections added by section
19	2 of this	Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
20	appropria	te section numbers for the letters used in designating
21	the new s	ections in this Act.
