A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE RE-EMPLOYMENT OF RETIREES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. As received by the Committee, the purpose of
- 2 this Act is to allow state and county governments to rehire
- 3 retired employees as permanent workers in critical-to-fill or
- 4 labor shortage positions, without the retirees incurring any
- 5 negative impact on their normal retirement benefits.
- 6 Since hearing this Act, the following facts were brought to
- 7 our attention. As of September 30, 2006, an estimated 10% of
- 8 our state public employees are eligible to retire and by fiscal
- 9 year 2011 the figure is anticipated to rise to 26%. As the
- 10 "Baby Boomers" begin to retire, the vacancies will continue to
- 11 increase. It is estimated that by the year 2011, one out of
- 12 every four residents in our State will be over 65 years old.
- 13 Based on these statistics, it is imperative that our State
- 14 and county governments address this vacancy issue. Therefore,
- 15 it is the intent of the Legislature that this measure is a
- 16 temporary stop-gap measure to allow the State and county

- 1 governments to develop plans to address filling these vacancies 2 by Hawai'i's youth. 3 SECTION 2. Chapter 88, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 4 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to 5 read as follows: "§88- Re-employment of state and county retirants. (a) 6 7 Appointing authorities in the state and the various counties may employ a retired state or county employee, who is receiving 8 9 retirement benefits under this chapter, as designated by the 10 human resources director of the appropriate jurisdictions. Each 11 jurisdiction shall make employer contributions on the rehired employee's compensation to the pension accumulation fund in 12 13 accordance with Section 88-122(e). If the position is a civil 14 service position, then a retirant subject to this section shall 15 be recruited and selected for the position following civil 16 service procedures. To qualify for full-time employment, the 17 retirant shall have been retired from a State or county position 18 for at least five consecutive calendar years from the employee's 19 date of retirement. The human resources director of the 20 appropriate jurisdiction, shall certify that the retiree was hired in accordance with applicable civil service laws and as 21

15	returning to work and relinquishing the employee's retirement	
16	benefits to earn additional service credit and gain additional	
17	retirement benefits for a future retirement date as may be	
18	allowed by this chapter.	
19	(d) For the purposes of this section:	
20	"Jurisdiction" means the city and county of Honolulu, the	
21	county of Hawai'i, the county of Maui, the county of Kaua'i, the	
22	departmen	t of education, the judiciary, the Hawai'i health

- 1 systems corporation, the office of Hawaiian affairs, state
- 2 executive branch, and the legislative branches of the State and
- 3 county governments.
- 4 "State executive branch" means all the departments of the
- 5 State executive branch of government except the university of
- 6 Hawai'i, the Hawai'i health systems corporation and the
- 7 department of education."
- 8 SECTION 3. Each jurisdiction utilizing the provisions in
- 9 Section 2 of this Act shall report annually to the legislature
- 10 no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the
- 11 legislature on the number of positions filled pursuant to this
- 12 Act to include, but not be limited to, job title, salary and the
- 13 length of time each retirant was hired and other pertinent
- 14 information.
- 15 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 16 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007 and
- 17 shall be repealed on June 30, 2012.
