## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MINIMUM HOURLY WAGE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 387-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by amending the definition of "wage" to read as follows:
- 3 ""Wage" means (except as the department may provide under
- 4 section 387-11) legal tender of the United States or checks on
- 5 banks convertible into cash on demand at full face value thereof
- 6 and in addition thereto the reasonable cost as determined by the
- 7 department, to the employer of furnishing an employee with
- 8 board, lodging, or other facilities if such board, lodging, or
- 9 other facilities are customarily furnished by such employer to
- 10 the employer's employees. Except for the purposes of [the last
- 11 sentence of section [387-2,] 387-2(b), "wage" shall not include
- 12 tips or gratuities of any kind."
- 13 SECTION 2. Section 387-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- 15 "§387-2 Minimum wages. (a) Except as provided in section
- 16 387-9 and this section, every employer shall pay to each
- 17 employee employed by the employer, wages at the rate of not less
