A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GAMBLING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is a

2 proliferation of vending machines that dispense "sweepstakes"

3 game cards that can also be used to make brief long distance

telephone calls. These cards typically cost \$1 each and, while 4

vendors make it possible to obtain a card by mail at no cost, 5

6 these cards are from a separate pool of possible winners than

the pool comprised of a set of cards placed in a vending 7

machine. 8

The legislature further finds that purchasers may buy one 9

hundred or more of these cards in an effort to win a cash prize

11 and often dispose of losing cards instead of using them to

12 obtain the one- or two-minute long distance calls each card

13 authorizes. With the wide availability of low-cost and flat

14 rate long distance calling plans on land line telephone accounts

15 and free long distance calling plans on cellular telephone

accounts, the \$1 cost of one of these "sweepstakes" cards far

exceeds the value of the long distance calls authorized by the

- 1 card and the ability to make a long distance call with the card
- 2 is clearly incidental to its value as a "sweepstakes" entry.
- 3 These "sweepstakes" cards are not like the chances to win prizes
- 4 offered by, for example, fast food restaurants because those
- 5 chances are offered in connection with, and merely incidental
- 6 to, the sale of a bona fide product, namely, a meal.
- 7 The purpose of this Act is to clarify that, where the
- 8 chance to win something of value is offered in conjunction with
- 9 purchase of an item, the activity constitutes gambling, even if
- 10 a chance to win is offered by mail at no cost, if the item is
- 11 offered at a price that is disproportionate to the value of the
- 12 item, or if the chance to win at no cost by mail is offered from
- 13 a pool different from the pool from which the chance to win via
- 14 purchase is drawn.
- 15 SECTION 2. Section 712-1220, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:
- 17 "§712-1220 Definitions of terms in this part. In this
- 18 part unless a different meaning plainly is required, the
- 19 following definitions apply.
- 20 [\(\frac{1}{2}\)] "Advance gambling activity". A person "advances
- 21 gambling activity" if [he] the person engages in conduct that
- 22 materially aids any form of gambling activity. Conduct of this



17	definition is not rendered otherwise by the fact that free play		
18	is offered by mail as an alternative to play via purchase of:		
19	(1) An item that is not bona fide or is offered at a price		
20	that is disproportionate to the value of the item

         [(4)] "Gambling". A person engages in gambling if [he] the

    person stakes or risks something of value upon the outcome of a

    contest of chance or a future contingent event not under [his]

    the person's control or influence, upon an agreement or

    understanding that [he] the person or someone else will receive
    something of value in the event of a certain outcome. Gambling

    does not include bona fide business transactions valid under the

    purchase or sale at a future date of securities or commodities,
    and agreements to compensate for loss caused by the happening of

- 3 [(8)] "Player" means a person who engages in gambling
- solely as a contestant or bettor. 4
- 5 [(9)] "Profit from gambling activity". A person "profits
- 6 from gambling activity" if [he] the person accepts or receives
- 7 money or other property pursuant to an agreement or
- 8 understanding with any person whereby [he] the person
- 9 participates or is to participate in the proceeds of gambling
- 10 activity.
- $[\frac{(10)}{(10)}]$ "Social gambling" is defined in section 712-1231. 11
- 12 [(11)] "Something of value" means any money or property,
- 13 any token, object, or article exchangeable for money or

Gambling; Lottery; Sweepstakes

Description:

Amends definition of gambling to clarify that purchase of sweepstakes entry that also provides nominal non-gambling value constitutes gambling even if sweepstakes entry can be obtained without payment of consideration.
