A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FERAL CATS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State continues 1 2 to face an overpopulation of feral cats--that is, tame cats that 3 have been abandoned by irresponsible owners and the progeny of these cats which are often unsocialized to human contact. 4 problems attributed to this cat population include public health 5 6 risk and nuisance to humans, unchecked reproduction, and 7 predation of birds. Feral cats are known to transmit diseases 8 such as ringworm, pinkeye, parasitic worms, Lyme disease, and 9 toxoplasmosis. Such diseases may be spread through direct
- 10 contact, feces, or fleas and ticks. Further, the mating
 11 behaviors of unneutered feral cats can lead to excessive noise
 12 and male urine spray smells.
- 13 Feral cat colonies also endanger the State's native bird
 14 population, and food left after public feedings of feral cats
 15 may attract other native bird predators such as rodents and
 16 mongoose. The purpose of this Act is to prohibit the feeding of
