## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE NUMBER OF BLIND, DEAF, AND DEAF-BLIND PERSONS IN THE STATE OF HAWAII.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there are no current,
- 2 accurate statistics on the blind, deaf, and deaf-blind community
- 3 in the State of Hawaii.
- 4 SECTION 2. The department of human services shall conduct
- 5 a comprehensive demographic survey of the blind, deaf, and deaf-
- 6 blind community in Hawaii, including an evaluation of available
- 7 services and a needs assessment. The demographic data collected
- 8 shall include specific breakdowns by island and county. The
- 9 department of human services may contract with a third party to
- 10 conduct the survey, including the University of Hawaii; provided
- 11 that any third party shall work in collaboration with the
- 12 department of health and be assisted by the disability and
- 13 communication access board in carrying out the survey. "Blind"
- 14 and "deaf" shall have the same meaning as in section 235-1,
- 15 Hawaii Revised Statutes, for the purposes of this Act.
- 16 The department of human services shall collaborate with the
- 17 disability and communication access board to produce and submit



- 1 the results of the survey to the legislature no later than
- 2 twenty days prior to the convening of the 2009 regular session.
- 3 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 5 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for a
- 6 comprehensive demographic survey of the blind, deaf, and deaf-
- 7 blind community in the State, including an evaluation of
- 8 available services and a needs assessment, and statistical
- 9 breakdowns by island and county.
- 10 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 11 human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
