A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII PENAL CODE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 706, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
- 3 to read as follows:
- 4 "PART . GOVERNOR'S PARDONS
- 5 §706- Pardon procedures. (a) No pardon may be issued
- $oldsymbol{6}$ by the governor except upon application to the governor for a
- 7 pardon by the person seeking a pardon.
- **8** (b) If the applicant has been incarcerated or has
- 9 otherwise been on parole for the crime sought to be pardoned,
- 10 the governor shall refer the application for a pardon to the
- 11 Hawaii paroling authority.
- 12 (c) If the applicant has not been incarcerated or has
- 13 otherwise been on probation for the crime sought to be pardoned,
- 14 the governor shall refer the application for a pardon to the
- 15 judiciary.
- 16 (d) The Hawaii paroling authority or the judiciary, as
- 17 applicable, shall furnish the governor, as soon as may be after

- 1 a referral under subsection (b) or (c), all information in their
- 2 possession respectively concerning the prisoner, together with a
- 3 recommendation as to the granting or refusing of the pardon. No
- 4 pardon shall be issued without receipt by the governor of such
- 5 information.
- 6 §706- Notice of intention to pardon. Not less than
- 7 thirty days prior to issuance of a pardon pursuant to this
- 8 section, the governor shall give public notice in accordance
- 9 with section 1-28.5, of an intention to issue a pardon to any
- 10 person. The notice shall state the name of the person to be
- 11 pardoned, the offense for which the person is being pardoned,
- 12 the date of the sentencing for that offense, and the reason for
- 13 the pardon."
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 353-72, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 "§353-72 Pardons; reference to paroling authority. The
- 17 director of public safety and the Hawaii paroling authority
- 18 shall consider every application for pardon [which may be
- 19 referred to them by the governor and shall furnish the governor,
- 20 as soon as may be after such reference, all information possible
- 21 concerning the prisoner, together with a recommendation as to
- 22 the granting or refusing of the pardon.] in accordance with
