## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH INSURANCE.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 431, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to article 10A to be 2 3 appropriately designated and to read as follows: 4 "§431:10A- Oral chemotherapy treatment coverage. Each 5 accident and health or sickness policy, contract, plan, or agreement shall provide coverage for a prescribed chemotherapy 6 7 agent as a medical benefit, and not as a drug benefit, 8 regardless of whether the agent is to be administered 9 intravenously, orally, or by injection." 10 SECTION 2. Chapter 432, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 amended by adding a new section to article 1 to be appropriately 12 designated and to read as follows: 13 "§432:1- Oral chemotherapy treatment coverage. All 14 individual or group hospital or medical service plan contracts 15 shall provide coverage for a prescribed chemotherapy agent as a 16 medical benefit, and not as a drug benefit, regardless of 17 whether the agent is to be administered intravenously, orally, 18 or by injection."

- 1 SECTION 3. Section 432D-23, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "§432D-23 Required provisions and benefits.
- Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, each 4
- 5 policy, contract, plan, or agreement issued in the [State] state
- after January 1, 1995, by health maintenance organizations 6
- 7 pursuant to this chapter, shall include benefits provided in
- sections 431:10-212, 431:10A-115, 431:10A-115.5, 431:10A-116, 8
- 9 431:10A-116.5, 431:10A-116.6, 431:10A-119, 431:10A-120, [and]
- 431:10A-121, and 431:10A- , and chapter 431M." 10
- SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that 11
- 12 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 13 begun, before its effective date.
- 14 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 15 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 16 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2009.
