BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 708-813, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

3	"(1)	A pe	erson commits the offense of criminal trespass in
4	the first	degr	ee if:
5	(a)	That	person knowingly enters or remains unlawfully:
6		(i)	In a dwelling; or
7		(ii)	In or upon the premises of a hotel or apartment
8			building;
9	(b)	That	person:
10		(i)	Knowingly enters or remains unlawfully in or upon
11			premises that are fenced or enclosed in a manner
12			designed to exclude intruders; and
13		(ii)	Is in possession of a firearm, as defined in
14			section 134-1, at the time of the intrusion; $[\frac{or}{}]$
15	(c)	That	person enters or remains unlawfully in or upon
16		the p	oremises of any public school as defined in
17		sect:	ion 302A-101, or any private school, after
18		reaso	onable warning or request to leave by school

1		authorities or a police officer; provided [however,			
2		such] that a warning or request to leave shall be			
3		unnecessary between 10:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m.; or			
4	<u>(d)</u>	That person enters or remains unlawfully in or upon			
5		the premises of any public housing project, as defined			
6		in section 356D-1 or 356D-91, after reasonable warning			
7		or request to leave by housing authorities or a police			
8		officer; provided that a warning or request to leave			
9		shall not be necessary between 10:00 p.m. and 5:00			
10		a.m.; provided further that the person is not an			
11		invited guest. For purposes of this section, an			
12		"invited guest" means a person who enters or remains			
13		in or upon the premises of any public housing project			
14		in response to an express or implied invitation of a			
15		resident and who is not in violation of any law or			
16		<pre>public housing project rule."</pre>			
17	7 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that				
18	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were				
19	begun, before its effective date.

Criminal Trespass; Public Housing Project

Description:

Amends criminal trespass in the first degree to include a person who enters or remains unlawfully in or upon the premises of a public housing project after reasonable request or warning to leave by housing authorities or a police officer. Excludes an invited guest.
