A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 The legislature finds that small businesses SECTION 1. comprise over ninety-six per cent of all businesses in Hawaii 2 and create eighty-three per cent of all net new jobs in the 3 4 State. The Hawaii Small Business Development Center Network (Center) assists small businesses by providing high quality 5 counseling, training, and research services to entrepreneurs and 6 small businesses in the areas of business startup, retention, 7 and expansion through its counseling centers on the islands of 8 Hawaii, Kauai, Maui and Oahu. Funded in part through a 9 cooperative agreement with the United States Small Business 10 Administration, the Hawaii Small Business Development Center 11 Network requires state matching funds and an affiliation with a 12 university or community college. The University of Hawaii at 13 Hilo is designated as the host institution for the Hawaii Small 14 Business Development Center Network. 15 The Hawaii Small Business Development Center Network 16

- 1 financial skills to make their businesses thrive. In addition
- 2 to providing confidential one-on-one counseling by qualified
- 3 business professionals free of charge, the network also offers a
- 4 variety of in-class workshops, seminars, and online training.
- 5 The legislature further finds that investing in long term
- 6 business counseling has significant returns. In 2006, the
- 7 Hawaii Small Business Development Center Network provided long
- 8 term counseling to two hundred fifty-five small businesses and
- 9 aspiring entrepreneurs and helped them obtain \$6,300,000 in
- 10 financing. Long term counseling generated forty-two cents in
- 11 tax revenues for every \$1 spent on the Hawaii Small Business
- 12 Development Center Network program in 2006. Hence, for every \$1
- 13 spent on programs, the Hawaii Small Business Development Center
- 14 Network leveraged \$4.82 raised from external sources.
- The purpose of this Act is to appropriate moneys to the
- 16 Hawaii Small Business Development Center Network to further its
- 17 mission of providing counseling, training, and research services
- 18 to small businesses and entrepreneurs.
- 19 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 20 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$542,910 or so much
- 21 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009, for
- 22 creating sustainable economic development through consulting,
