A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PARKING FOR DISABLED PERSONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to allow companies
- 2 or facilities whose primary function is to transport disabled
- 3 persons to qualify for removable windshield placards and license
- 4 plates that designate the approved use of parking stalls
- 5 reserved for disabled persons.
- 6 SECTION 2. Section 291-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 1. By adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
- 9 and to read:
- 10 ""Qualified company or facility" means a company, nonprofit
- 11 organization, or facility that has applied for and received a
- 12 temporary removable windshield placard, a removable windshield
- 13 placard, or special license plates, and an identification card
- 14 issued through rules adopted by the disability and communication
- 15 access board pursuant to section 291-56."
- 16 2. By amending the definition of "removable windshield
- 17 placard" to read:



1 ""Removable windshield placard" means a two-sided, hanger-2 style placard issued under this part to a qualified company or 3 facility, or a person with a disability who presents a 4 certificate of disability that verifies that the applicant's 5 disability is expected to last for at least four years." 6 3. By amending the definition of "temporary removable windshield placard" to read: 7 8 ""Temporary removable windshield placard" means a 9 two-sided, hanger-style placard issued under this part to [a]: 10 (1) A person with a disability who presents a certificate of disability that verifies the person's disability in 11 12 monthly increments, which shall not exceed six 13 months [-]; and 14 (2) A qualified company or facility for a temporary period set by rules adopted by the disability and 15 communication access board." 16 SECTION 3. Section 291-51.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 17 amended to read as follows: 18 "§291-51.5 Special license plates. (a) Upon application 19 by a person with a disability, each county shall issue special 20 license plates for the vehicle registered in the applicant's 21 name if the vehicle is primarily used to transport that person. 22



- 1 (b) Each county shall issue special license plates for 2 each vehicle shown to be owned and operated by a qualified 3 company or facility and used for the primary purpose of 4 providing transportation services to persons with disabilities. 5 Any limit on the number of special license plates that may be 6 issued to a single qualified company or facility may be set by 7 the disability and communication access board. 8 (c) The fee for the issuance of special license plates 9 shall not exceed the fee charged for similar license plates for 10 the same class vehicle." 11 SECTION 4. Section 291-51.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 12 amended to read as follows: 13 "§291-51.6 Issuance of temporary removable windshield
- placards. (a) Each county shall issue one temporary removable windshield placard and a second temporary removable windshield placard to each applicant who requests and presents a certificate of disability that verifies the duration of the applicant's disability in monthly increments, which shall not exceed six months, and upon payment of a fee to the issuing agency.
- (b) Each county shall issue to a qualified company or
 facility a temporary removable windshield placard approved



- 1 through rules adopted by the disability and communication access
- 2 board. A qualified company or facility that is issued a
- 3 temporary removable windshield placard may, upon its expiration,
- 4 apply for a new temporary removable windshield placard in
- 5 accordance with rules adopted by the disability and
- 6 communication access board.
- 7 (c) All fees collected by the counties for issuing
- 8 temporary removable windshield placards shall be deposited into
- 9 the state general fund.
- 10 (d) The temporary removable windshield placard shall be
- 11 designed, fabricated, and sold to the counties at a rate
- 12 negotiated by the disability and communication access board."
- 13 SECTION 5. Section 291-52, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- 15 "§291-52 Issuance of removable windshield placard. (a)
- 16 Each county shall issue one removable windshield placard and a
- 17 second removable windshield placard to each applicant who so
- 18 requests and presents a certificate of disability that verifies
- 19 that the applicant's disability is expected to last for at least
- 20 four years. The removable windshield placard shall expire four
- 21 years after the date of its issuance.

1 Each county shall issue a removable windshield placard (b) 2 to a qualified company or facility approved through rules 3 adopted by the disability and communication access board, with 4 an expiry date that is set by rule. 5 The removable windshield placard shall be designed, fabricated, and sold to the counties at a rate negotiated by the 6 7 disability and communication access board." 8 SECTION 6. Section 291-52.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 9 amended to read as follows: 10 "§291-52.5 Issuance of identification card. Each issuing 11 agency shall issue [one] an identification card at the same time it issues a removable windshield placard, temporary removable 12 windshield placard, or special license plates to a person with a 13 14 disability[-] or to a designated employee of a qualified company 15 or facility. A limit on the number of identification cards that 16 may be issued to a single qualified company or facility may be set by the disability and communication access board." 17 SECTION 7. Section 291-52.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 18 19 amended to read as follows: 20 "§291-52.6 Replacement of a lost, stolen, or mutilated removable windshield placard or identification card. A 21

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    All fees collected by the counties for replacement of a lost,
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    stolen, or mutilated removable windshield placard shall be
    deposited into the state general fund."
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         SECTION 8. Section 291-52.7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended to read as follows:
         "§291-52.7 Fraudulent manufacture or alteration of
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    placards and identification cards. Any person who fraudulently
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    manufactures or alters a removable windshield placard, temporary
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- 1 removable windshield placard, or identification card for
- 2 personal use, sale, or issuance to another person or entity to
- 3 circumvent the issuance requirements of this part, or any person
- 4 [who] or entity that uses a fraudulently manufactured or altered
- 5 placard or identification card to circumvent the issuance
- 6 requirements of this part, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.
- 7 The fraudulent manufacture or alteration of each placard and of
- 8 each identification card for personal use, sale, or issuance or
- 9 [is otherwise used] any other use of the placard or
- 10 identification card in violation of this section shall
- 11 constitute a separate offense."
- 12 SECTION 9. Section 291-53, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 "§291-53 Nontransferability; penalty. The removable
- 15 windshield placard, temporary removable windshield placard, or
- 16 special license plates shall not be used by [anyone] any party
- 17 other than the person with a disability or qualified company or
- 18 facility to [whom] which it [is] has been issued unless it is
- 19 being used in connection with the transport of [the] a person
- 20 with a disability $[\cdot]$ who has been issued a valid identification
- 21 card under this part. An unauthorized person or entity using
- 22 the removable windshield placard, temporary removable windshield



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- 1 placard, or special license plates to obtain the special parking
- 2 privileges authorized under this part or otherwise afforded by
- 3 the State or counties, shall be guilty of a traffic infraction
- 4 under chapter 291D and fined not less than \$250 nor more than
- 5 \$500. A removable windshield placard, temporary removable
- 6 windshield placard, or special license plates may be confiscated
- 7 by a law enforcement officer or commissioned volunteer
- 8 enforcement officer of the county law enforcement agency for any
- 9 unauthorized use."
- 10 SECTION 10. Section 291-57, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- "(a) Any person who uses a parking space reserved for
- 13 persons with disabilities who:
- 14 (1) Fails to properly display a removable windshield
- 15 placard, a temporary removable windshield placard, or
- special license plates;
- 17 (2) Displays an invalid removable windshield placard, an
- invalid temporary removable windshield placard, or
- invalid special license plates;
- 20 (3) Uses a removable windshield placard, a temporary
- 21 removable windshield placard, or special license plate
- that was not issued to that person, that person's

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              employer as a qualified company or facility, or to any
              passengers occupying the vehicle in the parking space;

              With or without a removable windshield placard, a

              (A) Parks in an access aisle; or
              (B) Obstructs the ingress or egress to a parking
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                   space reserved for a person with a disability;
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    shall be quilty of a traffic infraction under chapter 291D and
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    shall be fined not less than $250 nor more than $500 and pay any
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    costs incurred by the court related to assessing the fine;
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    provided that a person with a disability who has been issued a
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    valid placard or special license plate that is currently in
    effect, and who has failed to display the placard or license
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    plate while parking in a space reserved for persons with
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    disabilities, shall pay a fine of not less than $25 nor more
    than $100 and any costs incurred by the court related to
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    assessing the fine."
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         SECTION 11. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
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    and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
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1 SECTION 12. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
