## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BEACHES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 201B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§201B-A</u> <u>Visitor area beach restoration special fund.</u> (a)
5	There is established the visitor area beach restoration special
6	fund to be administered by the authority, into which shall be
7	deposited the revenues prescribed by section 237D-6.5(b). All
8	investment earnings from the moneys in the special fund shall be
9	credited back to the visitor area beach restoration special
10	fund.
11	(b) Moneys in the visitor area beach restoration special
12	fund shall be used to provide for the development and
13	restoration of sandy beaches and the maintenance of any
14	permanent improvements placed on the beaches or in the nearshore
15	waters for visitor area beaches throughout the State, as
16	determined by the authority, including debt service on any
17	capital expenditures projects and the contracting for services

14		balance of \$5,000,000 in the tourism emergency trust

9	project fronting the Royal Hawaiian Hotel on Waikiki beach on
10	Oahu.
11	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii
12	tourism authority for the purposes of this Act.
13	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
14	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
15	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
